PTFA (All Parents/ Carers)

I included information about a PTFA in last weeks update but fell into the trap of using an acronym without explaining what it is. A PTFA (Parents, Teacher and Friends Association) is a group that operates independently of the school (often as a separate charity with its own bank accounts etc) to support the school through helping with activities in school or by arranging events to support the school financially. All of the monies raised are then spent on resources for children which are agreed through the PTFA via a request from staff or children.

I have been approached by a parent who has raised the prospect of starting a PTFA in order to support activities and fundraising in school. Whilst a PTFA would be a great asset to the academy, it would rely on volunteers to run this and go through the legal process to set up the group and operate it. We are happy to arrange an initial open meeting to support parents who are keen to set this up but would like to gauge interest. Key Messages

Ready, Respectful, Safe (All Parents/ Carers)

Our Behaviour Curriculum this week focused on 'Belonging' and being kind and including others. Understanding how to treat each other with kindness and respect is so important especially from a young age so that we know how to do this as adults - ready for entering the world of work. Next week we will move onto knowing how to 'Support others' using the story 'Giraffe is left out' by Sue Graves. It is a lovely short text that explores the feelings of various animals in the classroom of being "left out". The actions against Leopard eventually occur to Giraffe, who realises how upsetting it is to be excluded from a group. This builds on our work about belonging this week.

This week in our Ready, Respectful, Safe programme, we focused on Digital Safety, aiming to ensure students understand the importance of staying safe in the digital world. Activities included a discussion about online safety, covering topics such as privacy settings, recognising and responding to cyberbullying and maintaining respectful online behaviour. Students participated in creating a digital safety activity, committing to positive and responsible internet use including checking their own privacy settings across a range of social media.

Repeated Messages

We have seen an increase in children bringing in a variety of items into school which are not allowed often by accident. Could I ask all parents to be vigilant and ensure you are fully aware of what children are bringing in bags etc.

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Pupil Admission Number Consultation - Reception (All Parents/ Carers)

Due to falling birth rates in the area, we are consulting on reducing the admission number for primary from 60 to 30 from September 2026. This would mean that we would only admit 30 children from this year onwards. Parents may be aware that we only have one group in the current Reception due to these falling numbers.
