Welcome back to the final half term of this academic year. I hope you all had a good break.

## Ready, Respectful, Safe (All Parents/ Carers)

Our behaviour curriculum continued this week in primary as we focused on learning more about 'Sharing'. A culture built on respect starts with how we communicate with each other. Some of our communication is not in the words we use, but in our physical actions. Simple things like taking turns and sharing fairly signifies respect and consideration for each other. Next week Primary will be focusing on 'Body Language'. Our body language is another form of communication because our faces and bodies can show how we are feeling but sometimes this is difficult for young children to see and interpret. In Secondary this week, they focused on using 'Respectful Body Language'. Our body language plays a large role in how we communicate our feelings. Positive body language builds trust, shows interest and conveys respect, openness and professionalism. Next week Secondary will move on to looking at 'Challenging Disrespect'.

## Wow Moments in School this Week (All Parents/ Carers)

- We were delighted to host the Claremont Steering group in school this week. 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### Safeguarding Update (All Parents/ Carers)

In the update before half term, we included some items linked to National Safeguarding Week. Some parents have contacted us to say they found this very helpful. Therefore, we will include a safeguarding update (where there is something to include) each week.

- Online Gaming and Gaming Videos A reminder to check the videos children are watching on YouTube linked to games being played online. Stopping children from playing games which are not age-appropriate does not stop them from accessing videos of these games being played online.
- Helmets and E-Scooters The Chief Inspector for Blackpool and Fylde police has personally reiterated in a
  meeting at Unity this week the dangers of e-scooters and made clear that children should not be riding them.
  A large-scale police operation will see extra officers addressing the issues with e-scooters over the next few
  weeks. If children are travelling to school on bikes they must be wearing helmets.

### Polling Station - Advance Notice (All Parents/ Carers)

The Prime Minister has called a General Election for the 4th July. Unity Academy will once again be used as a polling station. Previous experience of the use of the academy as a polling station for general elections indicate that there are large numbers of people who visit the polling station during the day. We are required to allow access for blue badge holders and so we have to allow some cars on site. We have asked for permission to close the gates during drop-off and pick-up times to ensure we can keep children safe.

This date does also clash with the new Year 7 transition day which cannot be moved and so we expect the area around the school to be very busy at the start and end of the day. If parents/carers could walk to school on this day, it would be very helpful.
