Unity Academy Policy Statement on Provider Access: Compliance with Section 42B of the Education Act 1997

Introduction

This policy statement sets out Unity Academy's arrangements for managing access of providers of technical education and apprenticeships to students in Years N to 11. It outlines the school's approach to ensuring that students are informed about the full range of education and training options available to them, in line with the statutory requirements under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997, also known as the 'provider access legislation.'

Student Entitlement

All students at Unity Academy are entitled to:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a career education program which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships within the local labour market.
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

Opportunities for Access

A number of events, integrated into the school's careers program, will offer providers an opportunity to come into school to speak to students. Providers are invited to request access for these events and activities as appropriate. Below is an outline of the types of events where access may be provided:

Premises and Facilities

The school will make suitable facilities available for discussions between providers and students, such as classrooms or the school hall, depending on the activity. The school will also make available relevant information to support the event (e.g., student attendance lists and available resources such as interactive whiteboards and sound systems).

Providers are encouraged to discuss their needs with the Careers Leader in advance to ensure that appropriate arrangements can be made.

Safeguarding

Unity Academy is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of students. Providers accessing the school will be expected to adhere to our safeguarding policy. Any visiting providers will be supervised by school staff throughout their visit and be provided with the relevant safeguarding information upon arrival.

Complaints

Any complaints regarding the school's handling of provider access requests should be made through the school's formal complaints procedure, which is available on our website.

Monitoring and Review

The Careers Leader will monitor the implementation of this policy and ensure compliance with the statutory requirements. The policy will be reviewed annually by the school's leadership team and governing body.
