Nursery



This week in nursery we have enjoyed reading the story 'The Smeds and the Smoos.' The children have spoken about the differences they can see between Bill and Janet and drawn a picture of one of them and some of us have wrote about the differences we can see. The child have spoken about how the characters feel about not being allowed to play together. The children have identified many differences they can see between their friends and themselves and some similarities.

We have also been counting 2 groups of objects and compared the, to see which group has the most/least and we have written some of our numbers. The children have also drawn pictures of themselves now and have spoken about what they have enjoyed most about being in nursery.

Reception



What a lovely week we have had in Reception! This week we have learnt about all things minibeasts to celebrate National Insect Week! We began by reading the story 'Mad About Minibeasts'. The children thoroughly enjoyed listening to this story; observing various types of minibeasts and learning interesting facts about them. We developed our learning further throughout the week by learning more in-depth facts about a variety of insects. We then utilised this learning by creating our own class books all about minibeasts. The children really wowed us with their fabulous recalling of facts, we really think this will be a book that the children will treasure throughout their time with us.

We continued our learning during provision through creating detailed observational drawings of minibeasts in our Creative Area, alongside honeycomb beehive pictures using paint and bubble wrap. We rescued minibeasts in our Funky Fingers Area and went on minibeast hunts in our outdoor area to see which bugs like to live in our outdoor space.

On Thursday we had an absolutely fantastic time at our Squirrel's Taster Session. We took part in a large range of activities including, planting, making binoculars, biscuit decorating, target throwing, badge making and decorating our own bug hotel. All of the children were so

calm and focused during the entirety of the session and most importantly all had huge smiles on their faces!

Year 1

We have had an incredibly busy this week in Year two. Our favorite part though was going to the Rock Gardens as part of our Enrichment Curriculum. Whilst there we bird watched and did some tallying to count how many we could see. We also did some live drawings of the environment. We had a great time and the children behaved excellently!

We looked at slippery shoes in Science as part of our Crest Awards. The children were really good at identifying the different types of grips which led onto a conversation about shoes suitable for different purposes.

In English, we have been looking at the Gingerbread Man and have been learning to use speech marks correctly.

Year 3



What another fabulous week in Year 3! This week, in Music, 3HB have been comparing "Three Little Birds" by Bob Marley to other reggae songs. They have also been playing some notes on the glockenspiel in tune to Bob Marley's song. They really impressed Mrs Hutt with their timing and it sounded wonderful! In French, 3LC have continued to learn new words and phrases. In RE we have continued exploring the importance of the River Ganges to the Hindu faith. The children have also looked at a map of India and identified its location.

In English, we have been reading Roald Dahl's 'The Twits' and had a very good laugh at the hilarious descriptions of Mrs and Mrs Twit. We have written adjectives and then expanded noun phrases about both characters, then turned these into very imaginative sentences such

as: "Although Mr Twit has a toothbrush, it never goes in his mouth!" and "If you saw Mrs Twit, you'd run for your life!"

In Maths, we have come to the end of our Money topic. We have worked really hard on understanding the value of coins, adding and subtracting, find and giving change. We even had our own mini shop this week where we could 'purchase' different items. We were given a shopping list and a small budget and found it very difficult to buy everything!

In Computing, we are continuing with Scratch to code different sprites and build a game. Additionally, we have begun our Enrichment of creating a board game in the classroom - we have linked this to our money topic- and had some fantastic games produced so far!

On Monday, year 3 will be taking part in a 'Art-draw-a-long' to look at how to capture detail in their drawings. For the final piece they can bring in a one small item to draw like a small soft toy, a memento or a book. This will need to be kept in their school bag during the rest of the day so we ask that it is small and that they will be responsible for the item so they will need to carefully consider which item to bring.

We have all been across to the Rock Gardens for a litter picking project as part of our English enrichment, we had a great time walking across in the sunshine, going on a woodland walk and looking after our environment.

In French this week, the children have been revising previously taught French so they are more confident with French numbers, colours and days of the week. This helped those who participated in the French parental engagement. A big thank you to Mrs Hutt this week for her amazing parental engagement session and thank you to those parents who could attend. The children enjoyed showing off everything they have been learning in school and it is so lovely to have parents in so you can all see what we get up to!

Another big thank you to Miss Tully who is leaving us this week. She has successfully completed her teacher training, CONGRATULATONS, we wish her all the best in her career and it has been a delight to have her as a part of our Year 4 team.


