Progress in Mathematics (KS2)	Significant improvement in disadvantaged pupil progress from 2018 to 2019.
Phonics	Scores close to national averages over the last two years
Other - attendance	Whole school attendance continues to be around 95%. Attendance of PP students is lower at 93.9% with non-disadvantaged at 94.9%
