



Impact of 2020-2021 PE and Sports grant.

- Children engaged in high quality PE lessons provided by Blackpool Football Club Community Trust. A variety of physical activities were taught to the children and they could continue the skills learnt in lunch time and after school clubs.
- Blackpool Football Club also provided children with a variety of activities to improve their physical fitness and promote active lifestyles; both at lunch time and after school.
- The new Merton scheme of work we purchased has been successful in upskilling staff subject knowledge with a clear progressive curriculum. This has linked in with KS3 objectives to maintain continuity in our through- school.
- Providing PE kits for the new Reception children allows equal opportunity for all children to start off their physical education journey. This ensures every child at Unity is able to take part in high quality PE lessons.
- The purchase of new sports equipment has ensured that children have access to appropriate resources for each lesson. It allows teachers to plan for and deliver a variety of physical activities including; gymnastics, dance, games and athletics.
- Providing children with a variety of playground equipment, including Basketball hoops, has ensured the children are active during playtimes. This has reduced the number of first aid incidents along with improved playground behaviour.
- Portable PA speakers have been used during playtimes to encourage the children to take part in dance activities. These have also been beneficial for wake and shake activities before and during school.
- Unfortunately some of our planned activities could not go ahead due to Covid-19 including inter school competitions, outdoor adventurous activities and Balance Bike sessions that were planned for later in the school year. Whilst these events could not take place we used the remaining sport premium to provide additional summer sports clubs and activities.

Due to Covid school closures last year only 1 class had their allocated swimming sessions as groups swap at February half term.
