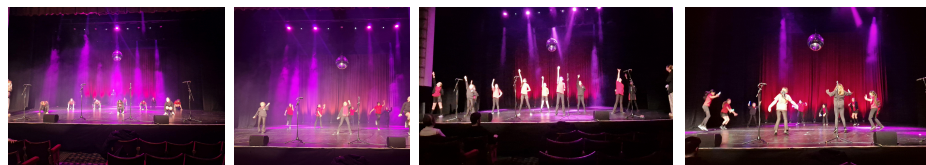

The primary RRS assembly this week was delivered by Mr Cooper and focused on the importance of our School Uniform. He spoke about the fact that it shows we are all a part of the same team and that our uniform symbolises this. Wearing a full school uniform is one of our school expectations and by wearing it we are showing that we are ready to learn at school and are respecting the expectations. Staff will be focusing on school uniform after the holidays to check that it is in place. The full uniform list is on the primary newsletter every week should you want to check it. The expectation is that children wear a Unity logo jumper, a white shirt, black trousers or skirt (not leggings), wear fully black shoes and have a full P.E. kit in school. After the holidays we will recap again on our school values and expectations to remind the children of them.

This week, our secondary **RRS** curriculum focused on the diverse world of **Careers in the Armed Forces**. Through a series of engaging assemblies and dedicated form-time sessions, our secondary students explored the vast array of pathways available—from engineering and logistics to medical services and peace-keeping roles.

These sessions are vital for helping our students understand how their skills can translate into global opportunities while reflecting on the importance of service and teamwork. It was fantastic to see so many students asking insightful questions and considering how their own strengths might shape their future careers.

Finally, this week, Y9 visited the University of Central Lancashire in Preston. This is an important visit to support the choice of GCSE Options for our students, and it provides a vital bridge between their current studies and their future aspirations. By stepping onto a high-performance campus, students can see firsthand how the subjects they choose today—from humanities to creative studies—translate into the specialist facilities and career paths of tomorrow.



## New Messages

### Attendance

Well done and thank you very much to all students, parents and carers for working very hard and successfully to improve attendance. This is having a very positive impact. Year on year primary attendance has increased by 1.5%, secondary by 4.4% and whole school attendance by 3.2%. Punctuality is also massively improved with late arrivals reduced by 68%. This translates into approximately **10000** days of additional school attendance! We now need to keep pushing to improve these yet further.

### Important Update - Introducing Pebble – Secondary Catering

After the half-term holiday, we will be upgrading how the canteen operates for secondary students for a faster and more efficient service.

#### ***What's changing***

We are moving from 4-digit pin numbers to fobs with QR codes

The FSM allowances will be accessible from 11am every day, rather than just on Thursday's and Friday's that we have been trialling for the last few weeks. Please continue to work with your child about managing their expenditure carefully to ensure they have a balanced food intake throughout the day.

The ability to accept cash via machines in school will be removed. If you have not already registered for MCAS, we encourage you to do so in order to add funds to your child's lunch account by card.

We have introduced a new "Simple Sandwich" of either cheese or ham in a bread roll for £1.35.

#### ***What will happen***

In morning registration on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> February your child will be issued with a fob with a personalised QR code on a house colour key ring. They should keep this safe and not share it with any other student. Lost fobs may incur a charge for a replacement.

If your child is not in registration on the first day back, it may delay them accessing the food provision at break or lunch. The same applies if they forget their fob on any single day.

At meal service, the fob is scanned by the machine, the student selects their food and the charge is made to their account accordingly. You will continue to be able to see purchases via MCAS as now.



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### ***Existing Balances***

Existing credit balances will be transferred over the half term holiday and as such you will not be able to add funds to your child's account from 2pm on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> February until 9am on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> February. This will allow us to make sure that only the relevant information is added to the new system.

In the unlikely event that you have a debit balance on a secondary dinner account, we will contact you about this separately.
