Ms Brayne and her class were extremely disappointed that they were not crowned the champions...Miss Purdy and her class though were on top of the world to be the winners! There was lots of competitiveness, humour and rock music! An all-round fantastic day!

Mr Cooper took 10 children to Hounds Hill yesterday to see the unveiling of the Eco Turtle. The bottle tops the children brought in last half term were used by an artist to create a sea turtle which highlights the powers of reusing, recycling and caring for our planet. It is a visual representation of how small actions can make a big difference. The Eco Turtle will move to its new home at Unity in December!

Mrs Bradshaw took 10 children from Year 5 to Blackpool 6th Form for a Creative Movement Event. The children took part in dance, drama and singing workshops culminating in a performance at the end presenting what they had learnt. RRS Behaviour Curriculum - In primary this week we have used the CitizenAID story 'Moggy's Coming' again which is a lovely story that the children know and enjoy. It supports children's understanding of staying safe in a non-threatening manner. It is done in a sensitive and engaging way to promote discussion about how to keep and stay safe in an emergency. We will come back to this story at various points throughout the year.







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This week, our focus in the secondary Ready, Respectful, Safe (RRS) curriculum has been on the importance of showing respect to staff. Some students have needed reminders about the language and tone we use when communicating with adults, prompting valuable discussions about respect as a cornerstone of our school community. The theme has been linked to wider ideas of human rights, societal freedom, and British values, encouraging students to think about how mutual respect supports positive relationships and a fair society. This message has also been reinforced through assemblies this week.

In other news, Year 7 students have enjoyed visits to UCLan in Preston over the past two days (with two forms attending each day) to take part in an inspiring careers event. The trip offered students an exciting glimpse into university life and helped them start thinking about future opportunities.

As we approach the half-term break, I hope everyone takes time to rest and recharge. We know many students will be enjoying the Halloween festivities, and we look forward to welcoming everyone back, ready to go again for the second half of term. A reminder that Year 11 mock exams are fast approaching, and we wish all our students well as they prepare. We're also looking forward to our Year 7 Settling-In Evening on Tuesday, 5th November, an important opportunity for families to meet with tutors and discuss how well our newest students have settled into secondary school life.

As usual, this has closed for the half term break and will be reopened at the start of half term 2.


