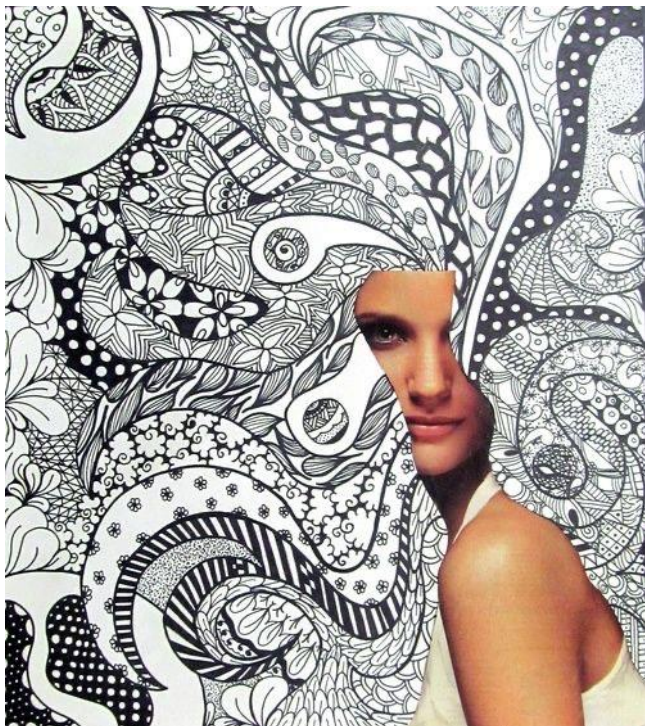


A HEAD FULL OF PATTERNS

Gustav Klimt, (July 14, 1862 - February 6, 1918), was an Austrian Symbolist painter and one of the most prominent members of the Vienna Art Nouveau (Vienna Secession) movement. His major works include paintings, murals, sketches, and other art objects, many of which combine realistic paintings of faces surrounded by richly decorated patterns.



Here are two examples of images from the Internet that combine the face with patterns in a similar way to Klimt. A photograph of a face has been cut out and stuck onto a sheet of paper. Then the artist has divided the paper into sections and filled each one with intricate patterns.



YOUR TASK

Produce a picture in a similar way to those above. Either draw a realistic face, or cut out a photograph from a newspaper or magazine. Then divide the rest of the paper into sections and fill them with various patterns and shapes. You can leave the patterns black and white or colour them.

You can use a cartoon face if you can not find a suitable photograph.
