<b>Region</b>	An area of land that has common features.			<h3>Major English cities in the North West</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Liverpool</li> <li>Manchester</li> <li>Lancaster</li> <li>Preston</li> </ul>
<b>City</b>	A place where people live and work that is larger than a town.			<h3>Land features of the Lake district</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mountains</li> <li>Rivers</li> <li>Lakes</li> <li>Peaks</li> <li>Woodland</li> </ul>
<b>Settlement</b>	A place where people live.			
<b>Ordnance survey map</b>	Mapping agency for Great Britain.			
<b>rural</b>	It is a location in the country. It is not usually as busy as an urban place.			
<b>map symbol</b>	It is a small picture on a map to tell you about something. There are symbols for schools, churches, post offices and pubs.			
<b>Hamlet</b>	A very small settlement with just a group of houses.			
<b>village</b>	Villages are small settlements with a small number of houses for a few hundred people. Most villages are found in the countryside.			
<b>urban</b>	A busy locations which has lots of houses and usually shops and offices.
