



Choices and consequences

CCI First verbal warning, poor choice logged on SIMS

Second verbal warning, possible 5 minutes after lesson, poor choices logged on SIMS

CC4 – HOD requests "on call"
Referred to Internal Exclusion, parent/cc

Counselling Conversation with classroom teacher

Guidance by HDD when removed to another cassroom, ounselled by classroom teacher during 30 minute department detention


Attendance and Punctuality

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





Curriculum Aims









