






WEAR YOUR UNIFORM WITH PRIDE

Pitch Rules







- Wear unsuitable boots / footwear as they can damage the carpet, NO BLADES / FULL METAL STUDS / SOFT GROUND STUDS/HYBRID OR MIXED STUD/FLAT SOLE TRAINERS.
- Smoke or Vape.
- No animals or pets.
- No jewellery.
- Do not place any sharp or heavy objects on the playing surface.
- Do not climb on goals, fences or nets.
- Use glass drinking vessels or bottles.
- Allow any solvents or liquids to be spilled.
- Eat beyond the entrance to pitch.
- · Chew Gum.
- · Use chairs of any type.
- No spectators/parents on the pitch, only coaches and players (except in medical emergencies).



- Use appropriate footwear, i.e. AstroTurf- specific -Artificial Ground (AG) Boots,

- Ensure goals and posts are secure before playing.
- Move goals using wheels only.
- Water only on the pitch, no other food or drink.
- Close all gates during play.
- Report any damage Immediately to office.

- If confiscated, they will be placed in school safe for parents to collect.


