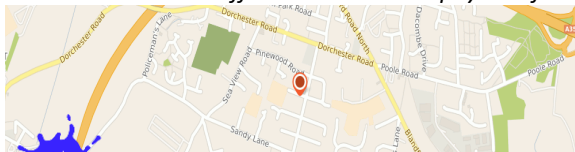


Brilliant geographers know that geographical features & culture differ in contrasting countries.



1. What are Upton's human and physical features?

We will recap the meaning of a human and physical feature before using maps and Google Earth to locate the different human and physical features of our local area – Upton.



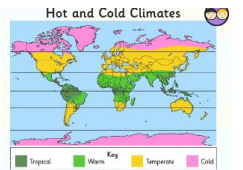
Brilliant geographers know the human and physical features of Upton and can locate them using maps.

5. How do brilliant geographers compare the weather conditions of two different countries?

We will recap the different climates across the world before focusing on the climates of the UK and India. We will look at the difference in their climates and weather before making comparisons between the two.

2. Where is Chembakolli?

We will locate India on a world map and recap our previous continent knowledge about Asia. Using a map of India, we will locate the village of Chembakolli and begin to research into life in Chembakolli.

6. How is Chembakolli different to Upton?

The children will make comparisons between life in Upton and life in Chembakolli. They will discuss the difference in location in terms of human and physical features, weather and everyday life.

We will learn the different human and physical features in Chembakolli, with a particular focus on housing and schools. The children will discuss the location of Chembakolli in the mountain range, the Nilgiri hills.
