Meet some brilliant historians...



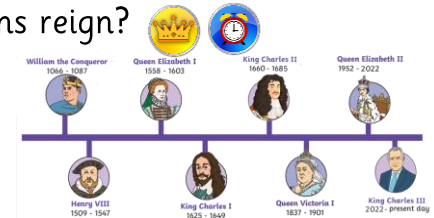
Lucy Worsley is a British historian, author and television presenter. She is Joint Chief Curator at Historic Royal Palaces.

We will use our knowledge of Kings and Queens to create a timeline of significant Kings and Queens.



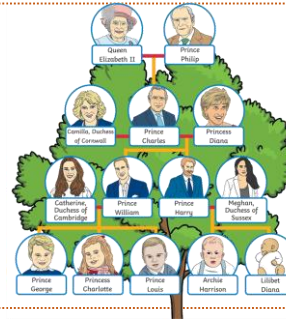

Who are the Royal Family?



We will learn about the key figures in the Royal Family and create a family tree of King Charles III, his parents, children and grandchildren. We will learn how changes in the monarchy impacts on national life

1 • Brilliant historians know key members of the royal family, and how changes in Kings and Queens impact on national life

How do brilliant historians know about the Royal Family?

We will use artefacts (take rubbings of coins, collect stamps, look at post boxes, memorial mugs, books and pictures) to ask and answer simple questions about the royal family, presenting our research in posters and leaflets.

Who was King Charles II?



We will learn about the life and times of 'The Merry King', King Charles II, comparing him to our current King, Charles III. We will learn about key events in his lifetime, including the Civil War, the Great Plague and The Fire of London.

We will learn about Queen Victoria and the Victorian period, looking at the technology and legacy of this period. We will compare it with our lives today to identify similarities and differences.

Key vocabulary: Glossary

timeline	sequencing events in chronological order	king	a male ruler who is usually born into a royal family
chronological	in time order	queen	a female ruler who is usually born into a royal family
artefacts	items from the past	monarch	a monarch is the 'head of state' - a king, queen or emperor
primary source	first-hand evidence such as diaries or photographs	reign	the time that a king or queen rules for
secondary source	second-hand evidence such as books
