Meet some brilliant historians...



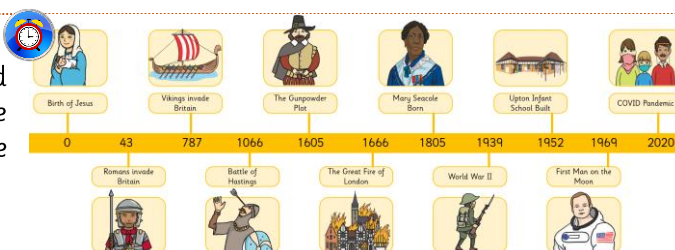
Tony Robinson has acted in many TV programmes about the past. On his 'Time Team' programme, he has helped archaeologists dig up artefacts to find out about the past.

We will use books, fact sheets, the internet and primary sources to learn about Mary Seacole's life and what she is remembered for. We will consider what questions we want to ask, and use a range of primary and secondary sources to find the answers.

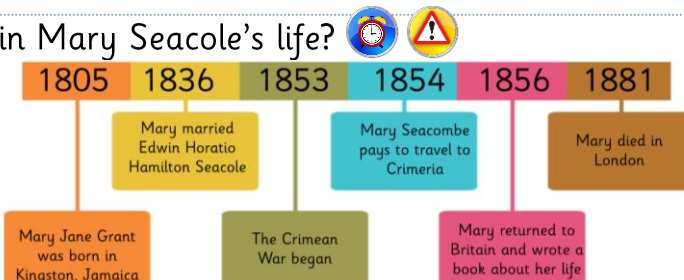


2 • Brilliant historians know we can use primary and secondary sources to find out about the past
