## **Knowledge and Understanding**

Use different materials: Explore a range of artists: To become a Dynamic Designer and Awesome Artist who can I can join different materials and explore different textures. choose and safely use the resources they need to make their I explore 'messy' materials such as cornflour, sand, rice, shaving foam. I can create a basic self portrait. **Captain Creative Professor Play** I have been shown and experienced how to paint in the style of Jackson Pollock. Have their own ideas (creative thinking). Find out and explore. I am able to explore different painting techniques with a variety of utensils (forks, Make links (building theories). Play with what they know. brushes, sponges...). Work with ideas (critical thinking). Be willing to 'have a go'. I can make observational drawings of flowers. **Physical development:** Use large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks. Use of Colour, Pattern, Texture, Line, Form, Space and Shape: (textiles, clay, sand, stone, 3D work, dough, boxes, paper sculpture, printing, Choose the right resources to carry out their own plan. Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making found materials, wood blocks, press print) snips in paper with scissors. I explore different materials freely, in order to develop ideas about how to use them and what to make. Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens I can join different materials & explore different textures. I have experienced: handling, feeling, and manipulating materials. and pencils. I can use variety of construction materials. I can describe the colour changes that take place when mixing together different coloured chalk/powder paint with water. I can use shapes to make pictures. I have used a ruler to make straight lines. I can choose hot colours and cold colours for my art work.

## **Core and Appropriate Vocabulary**

Drawing: pens, pencils, chalk, crayon, pencil crayon, line, colour, circle (also other shape names), rubber, draw, thick, thin, wavy, curly, dotted, broken, scribble.

Painting: brush, paint, mix, dip, colour names, primary colours, medium, thin, thick brush, block paint, powder paint, runny/thick/gloopy, artist, painter, watercolour.

Collage: stick, join, paper, collage, layer, attach, positional language, overlapping.

Artists: artist, same, different, painter, photographer, creator, James Brunt, Jackson Pollock, Picasso, Tin Man Lee, Mondrian, gallery, background.

**Other: straight, pattern,** explore, handle, feeling, ruler, curved, zig-zag, stripes, hot, cold, look at, illustrate, illustrator, dull, bright.
