PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE

We attended a local public health meeting yesterday. We were not told a great deal other that than there were, as yet, no signs of the new omicron variant in the area. We have updated our risk assessments and advised you last week to please ensure you wear face coverings and take extra care as a precautionary measure whilst those 'in the know' look into what the new variant is all about. What we can say is that contacts of the omicron variant will be told to isolate for ten days, whereas with the current variant, there is no expectation to. We will keep you up to date on information as soon as we know more.

NATIVITIES AND ST CLEMENTS

We've been communicating with you this week about having to cancel our St Clements

visit and about increasing the safety measures by only allowing one adult to each child for our infant nativities. We are genuinely so regretful about both of these actions. We held our first EYFS nativity this morning and whilst we were not all packed in like we have been in previous years, allowing further numbers would not have been appropriate in trying to limit the spread, as we would not have been able to support any social distancing whatsoever. The main thing is that our children have the opportunity to experience performing in front of an audience and seeing one of their close grown-ups there who are tremendously proud of them. We greatly appreciate your understanding in implementing these measures.
