ECO-SCHOOLS...a note from Mrs McNutt...

Eco schools is an award that as a school, we are aiming for. If we can achieve the award, we will have green flag status, which means that we will have an award that recognises our environmental actions. We set up an eco-committee with children in our committee from Reception all the way up to Year 6.

Eco schools is based around 10 topics that the eco committee have already completed a survey to figure out what they would like to work on. We have to focus upon three different areas out of 10. We will be working on biodiversity, energy and healthy living. The eco committee have already been taking part in a mindfulness survey, and are in the process of recording how many me minutes we complete as a school in a week. This will count towards our green flag application.

We are also in the process of encouraging wildlife into the school grounds. To do this, we are putting up bird feeders. We will be creating our own next week using apples and we have put some up ready to encourage some birds so that we can take part in Birdwatch 2023. The key stage 1 committee members have made bird seed feeders by freezing bird seed in ice and have put them up in the play garden. We can all take part in Birdwatch by counting the birds that we see using a special counting sheet. Birdwatch at home takes place between the 27th-29th January this year (as Mrs Vitkin has mentioned to the left!).

Then submit your results on the RSPB website. The eco committee will be taking part in the Big School Birdwatch over the next few weeks.

Finally we will be looking at saving energy. We are going to be looking at how we can help save energy in our school. The eco committee will become a little bit bossy over the next few months. They will be keeping a check upon if lights have been turned out when leaving the room.
