At Usworth Colliery, we have high expectations and aspirations for all. Oracy development is at the heart of the entire curriculum: children use key stem sentences to develop language structures and progression is designed across the curriculum in the Physical, Linguistic, Cognitive and Social & Emotional strands. Lessons are crafted to support pupils to build on prior knowledge, revisit key learning, practise key skills and make links, to help them learn more and remember more.

FRENCH INTENT

Usworth Colliery Primary School utilises Language Angels to ensure we offer a relevant, broad, vibrant and ambitious foreign languages curriculum that will inspire and excite our pupils using a wide variety of topics and themes. All pupils will be expected to achieve their full potential by encouraging high expectations and excellent standards in their foreign language learning - the ultimate aim being that pupils will feel willing and able to continue studying languages beyond key stage 2.

Content will be continuously updated and reviewed annually, creating a dynamic programme of study that will be clearly outlined in planning. This will ensure that the foreign language knowledge of our pupils progresses within each academic year and is extended year upon year throughout the primary phase and, in so doing, will always be relevant and in line with meeting or exceeding national DfE requirements.

The four key language learning skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing will be taught and all necessary grammar will be covered in an age-appropriate way across the key stage 2 primary phase. This will enable pupils to use and apply their learning in a variety of contexts, laying down solid foundations for future language learning and also helping the children improve overall attainment in other subject areas.

All pupils will develop a genuine interest and positive curiosity about foreign languages, finding them enjoyable and stimulating. Learning a second language will also offer pupils the opportunity to explore relationships between language and identity, develop a deeper understanding of other cultures and the world around them with a better awareness of self, others and cultural differences. The intention is that they will be working towards becoming life-long language learners.

We INTEND that our curriculum will be:

FRENCH IMPLEMENTATION

All KS2 classes will have access to a high-quality foreign languages curriculum. This will progressively develop pupil skills in foreign languages through regularly taught and well-planned weekly lessons which will be taught by class teachers. Units are progressive within themselves as subsequent lessons within a unit build on the language and knowledge taught in previous lessons. As pupils progress though the lessons in a unit they will build their knowledge and develop the complexity of the language they use. Pupil learning and progression will be assessed termly, where teachers will assess each language skill (speaking, listening, reading and writing).

Children will acquire, use and apply a growing bank of vocabulary, language skills and grammatical knowledge organised around a variety of topics and themes, building blocks of language into more complex, fluent and authentic language. Children will build on previous knowledge gradually as their foreign language lessons continue to recycle, revise and consolidate previously learnt language whilst building on all four language skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing. Lessons offering appropriate levels of challenge and stretch will be taught at all times to ensure pupils learn effectively, continuously building their knowledge of and enthusiasm for the language they are learning.

- > Each unit and lesson will have clearly defined objectives and aims.
- > Each lesson will incorporate interactive materials to offer ample speaking and listening tasks opportunities within lessons.
- > When applicable to further consolidate learning, lessons will incorporate desk-based reading and/or writing activities.
- > Extended reading and writing activities will be available so that native speakers can also be catered for.
- > Children will be given the opportunity to further develop their language learning by being challenged to recall previously learnt language and, by using it, will be able to recall it and use it with greater ease and accuracy. Upper key stage 2 classes will also have access to English-French dictionaries to extend their language beyond what has been taught in lessons.

FRENCH IMPACT

The impact of our languages curriculum is that pupils have a secure understanding of key French grammar, vocabulary and skills which will be the building blocks for future language learning. This can be seen in pupils' folders and through conversations with pupils where they show a firm grasp of the basics of speaking a foreign language in both oral and written form. Through observing the children, it can be seen that they show each other respect during collaborative tasks and support each other in their learning, adding to the inclusive, supportive classroom ethos created by the class teacher.

The impact of our curriculum is monitored by teachers who adapt teaching to meet the needs of learners. Through our languages curriculum, children develop speaking and listening skills which support their learning across the curriculum. These important communication skills enable children to develop their confidence with speaking, listening and interacting with others. Our children's horizons are broadened by experiencing a language and culture that may be different to their own. Pupil enjoyment and tolerance of diversity is evident in lessons. By comparing their own language to an alternative language, they deepen their understanding of the structure of their own language.
