Teaching Non-negotiables

<p>Teachers must ensure that they are using the SCARF scheme of work to teach all 6 strands of PSHCE.</p> <p>Lesson plans from SCARF often include a class warm up activities, introduction, activity, summing up section.</p>	<p>Make it clear that you are teaching a PSHCE lesson and what PSHCE stands for (especially KS2). Personal, Social, Health & Citizenship Education.</p>	<p>Ensure resources for the lesson are available before teaching.</p> <p>Sometimes, a Lynx board will need to be made for a lesson.</p> <p>Some lessons come with interactive resources and may not need a formal Lynx board (whiteboard paper can be used for recording ideas).</p>	<p><u>Talk</u></p> <p>Ensure there are opportunities for talk in all lessons (a chance for oracy).</p> <p>Depending on the subject matter, discuss confidentiality and being respectful to others.</p>	<p><u>Vocabulary</u></p> <p>Discuss any new vocabulary with children prior to and during the lesson.</p>	<p><u>Mental Health</u></p> <p>Lynx boards to be used in the class assembly slot.</p> <p>They do not have to be used in order.</p> <p>They might need adapting for you class needs.</p> <p>Pick and chose what you think your class needs.</p> <p>Some slides can be sued more than once (eg. breathing and meditation).</p>	<p><u>British Values</u></p> <p>Posters of the British Values need to be displayed in class.</p> <p>Over AU1, the British Values need to be explicitly taught.</p> <p>Democracy Rule of Law Respect Tolerance Individual Liberty.</p>	<p><u>Worry boxes and Class Check-ins</u></p> <p>Worry boxes to be stationed about 3CB and 6CS.</p> <p>Class Check-ins to be displayed somewhere in the classroom and be checked regularly by adults.</p>

RECORDING	<p>All lessons to be recorded in floor books.</p> <p>At the top of each page needs to be the date, the LO from the SCARF lesson and examples of work completed from all ability children.</p> <p>Any subject and issues that arise in class that have been subsequently tackled as a whole class lesson to also be recorded (bullying, racism, bereavement).</p> <p>Examples of ways to record: Post it notes, Photos, Pictures, Drawings, Mind maps, Posters...etc.</p>	<p>Some verbal lessons that can be recorded and uploaded to Seesaw under the class and in the PSHCE (which you will need to create).</p> <p>These will need to include a description of the lesson/the LO in the comments.</p>	<p>Children in Need 15th November 2024</p> <p>Anti-Bullying Week w/b 11th November 2024</p> <p>Children's Mental Health Week with Place2Be 3rd – 9th February 2025</p> <p>Red Nose Day Friday 21st March 2025</p> <p>PSHCE/Mental Health Open Morning – June 2025</p>	<p>We DO NOT assess for PSHCE anymore.</p>
