



INFORMATION FOR NEW RECEPTION PARENTS

Uniform

- ▶ Navy sweatshirt or cardigan
- ▶ Gold & yellow 'polo' shirt
- ▶ Navy, black or grey skirt or pinafore
- ▶ Navy, black or grey trousers,
- ▶ Navy, black, grey, white or cream plain socks or tights (no leggings)
- ▶ Black flat school shoes, trainers or boots (no stripes/logos or canvas shoes)

Note: All shoes must have filled in toes for health and safety reasons.

- ▶ PE KIT (PE bags for storage of these items are provided by the school)
- ▶ White short sleeved T shirt
- ▶ Navy or black shorts
- ▶ Track suit/jogging pants and sweatshirt for outdoor PE lessons
- ▶ Slip on black trainers and/or plimsoles.

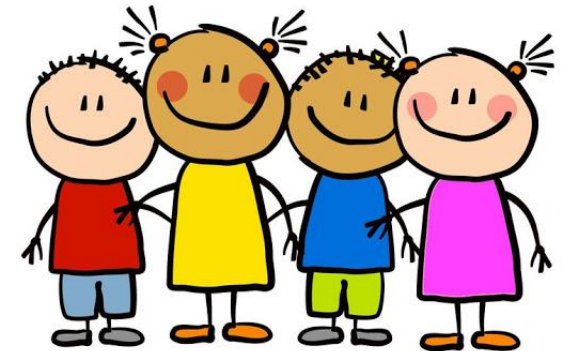
Pupil Premium Funding

The Pupil Premium is additional funding allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals. It is also allocated for those children who have been 'Looked After' continuously for more than six months and those from families with parents in the Armed Forces.

Pupil Premium funding is £1,345 for each eligible primary aged pupil.

Steps to starting school

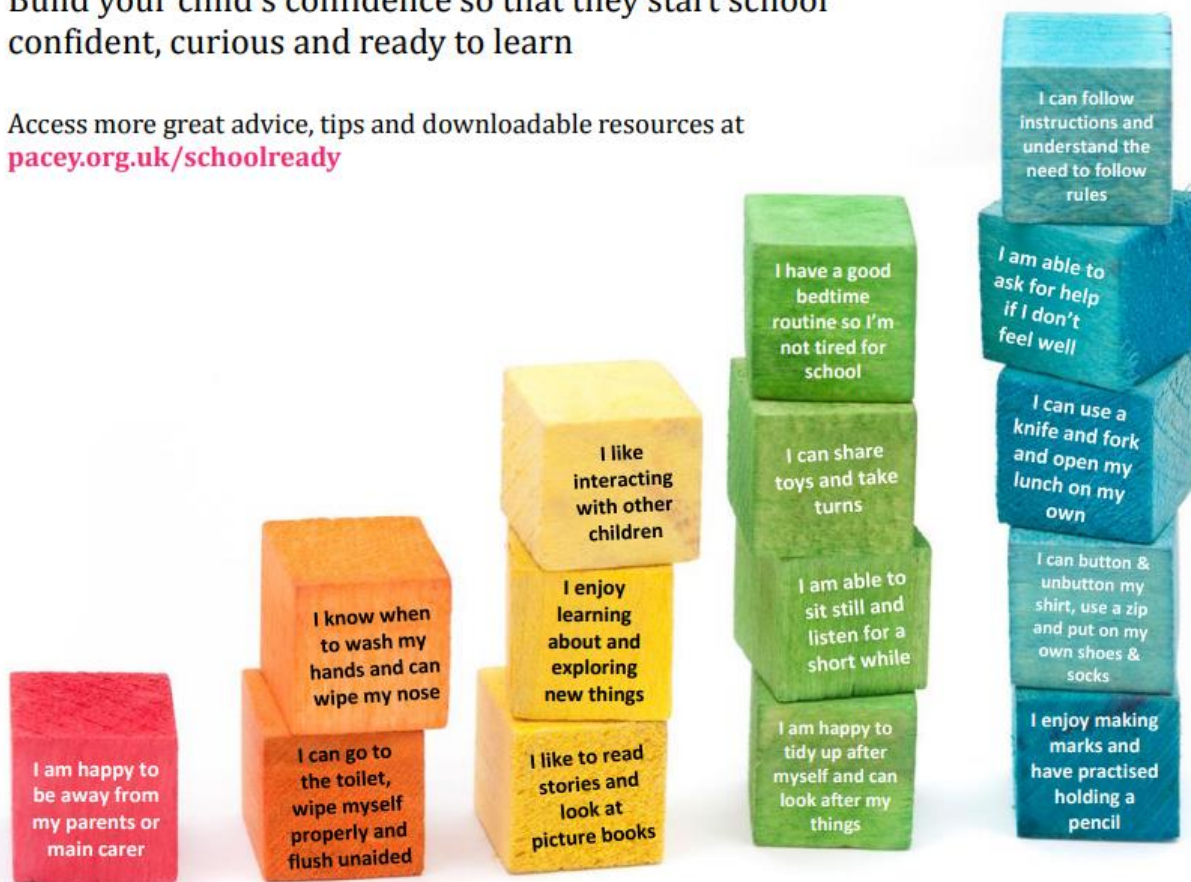
Build your child's confidence so that they start school confident, curious and ready to learn
