Explore	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Explain the purpose of a product, how it will work and how it will be suitable for the user.</li> <li>● Choose the best tools and materials, and explain choices (colourful thread for embroidery technique)</li> <li>● Talk about existing products considering: use, materials, how they work, audience, where they might be used; express personal opinion, likes and dislikes.</li> <li>● Evaluate how good existing products are</li> <li>● Identify and name the stitch being used.</li> </ul>	<p><b><u>To investigate different types of stitch to be able to identify a basic running stitch.</u></b></p> <p>Explore different types of stitch and identify how a running stitch can be used to embroidery a design.</p> <p>Explore and investigate existing products and take part in a class discussion based on opinions, likes and dislikes.</p>

Yes/No</p> <p>How effective was your design?</p> <p><b><u>Consider what went well and what could be done differently.</u></b></p> <p>Create a class mind map of what went well.</p> <p>Add text boxes in a different colour showing improvements that could be made (extra detail to be added, where appropriate, to explain how this would improve the finished bookmark).</p>
