Vouchers will be automatically sent out via email by the school office to parents who have already registered and are currently in receipt FSM. Please note that this is not the same as Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM), which all EYFS and KS1 children automatically receive.

YEAR 5 VISIT TO WASHINGTON ACADEMY

On Tuesday, Year 5 enjoyed an exciting day at Washington Academy. Both classes completed three engaging lessons, had lunch in the Pit Stop and even joined a lunchtime club, choosing between karaoke and trampolining. **5GS** began their day with a lively music lesson, exploring body percussion and trying their hand at the keyboard. VISITORS TO SCHOOL FROM NORTHERN GAS

This week, we were delighted to welcome Northern Gas Network into school to lead a series of exciting workshops on global warming and sustainability. Each year group took part in hands-on learning linked to real-world environmental issues.

Year 2 explored what causes global warming and investigated how these changes affect animals and their habitats.

Year 3 learned about renewable and non-renewable energy sources and carried out a practical experiment to compare how effective they are.

Year 4 had a workshop all about renewable energy. They looked at hydrogen car models, created the fuels from water and an energy source and then used this to power the cars. They checked to see how long the fuel lasted on do






different surface types. This workshop made links to their Geography topic, including discussions about whether cars should be banned from Newcastle city centre.

Year 5 focused on the Earth's atmosphere and climate, building on their existing knowledge of environmental change.

The children thoroughly enjoyed the workshops and engaged enthusiastically with the important themes of climate change and sustainability.
