SECONDARY SCHOOL APPLICATIONS FOR YEAR 6 PARENTS

All year 6 parents received an email from school last week with information about how to apply for secondary school places for your child. |Here is a brief outline of the information sent out. Applying online is the simplest option. Go to www.sunderland.gov.uk/admissionsonline to complete your application. You can apply on a variety of devices including a phone, tablet and PC or alternatively you can visit City Hall where there are facilities to apply on line. The online facility is open during the preference period - 9 September to 31 October 2024 If it is not possible to access or submit an online application, a paper application form can be obtained by emailing school.admissions@sunderland.gov.uk or by telephoning 0191 520 5560. If you apply on a paper application form, you will be informed of your child's school place by letter, which will be posted second class on 3 March 2025.

YEAR 3 TRIP TO THE F PIT



On Tuesday, year 3 went on a trip to the F Pit which linked to their current history topic, 'From Coal to Cars'. We walked there from school and the children were very sensible on the rods. When we arrived, one class had a tour inside the F Pit museum whilst the other class looked at the wheel from outside (they even had some time to play in the park!) When inside the museum, the children learnt about how the steam engine worked and

what it was used for (which was transporting the miners and the coal up and down a bit like a lift!). They got to see it working and were amazed that it would have run a lot faster when it was powered by steam. They then learnt about some of the difficulties and dangers the miners faced when they were working in the mine and were not impressed that children of their age used to work in the mines!

SPOTLIGHT ON MATHS



APPLICATIONS FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS

An email has been sent to all parents/carers about how to apply for free school meals. The key points are:

- If you have more than one child in school, you will need to apply for each child individually.
- Although children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 receive Universal Free School meals you may still be eligible which in turn would make you eligible to receive vouchers that are given out at certain times of the year.
- If your child has started Reception with us this year and they have siblings in our school who currently receive Free School Meals please remember you will need to apply for your reception child's Free School Meal as it is not automatically done when they start school.
