#### FREE SCHOOL MEALS

If you think that your child may be eligible for free school meals, then we urge you to complete the online form.

Free School Meals - Together for Children

If your child is in reception, Year 1 or Year 2 they automatically receive a free lunch as part of the Universal Free School Meals scheme. You have to apply for free school meals. THEREFORE, IT IS REALLY IMPORTANT YOU APPLY, IF YOU THINK YOU QUALIFY AND YOUR CHILD IS IN YEAR 2. THEY WILL NO LONGER GET FREE MEALS WHEN IN YEAR 3 IF YOU HAVE NOT APPLIED. We get updated lists of those who have applied on a weekly basis. Also, your child does not automatically receive free school meals even if a sibling in school does, you still have to apply for each child individually. Any questions then please contact the school office. We have received an email from together for children that they have received funding for the vouchers £60.00 per child. For the Summer holidays however, you only receive these if you are in receipt of free school meals. If you have applied and you If you are eligible for the vouchers, you will receive a text from school when they are ready to be collected.

#### PSHCE AND MENTAL HEALTH FAMILY OPEN MORNING

On Friday 21st June from 9am-1030am, we are hosting a PSHCE and Mental Health family open morning in school (in the hall) and we would love to invite you to collect your child from class to come to the main hall and see what it's all about! In our school, we teach PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education) on a weekly basis covering a wide range of issues and topics, always taking our lead from the children and teaching what is appropriate and necessary for the class and year group. Many lessons are drama or discussion based so we record our work in large 'floor books' and often use stories and scenarios to introduce



and teach certain topics. There will be a chance for you to look through your child's floor books and have a go at some of the activities and techniques that we use throughout school to promote PSHCE and good mental health. There will also be a comfy reading area where you can sit and read with your child. We have invited ambassadors from the local area to come along and promote their mental health services which are available to everyone. Hopefully we will see you there! Mrs. Swinburn.



#### YEAR 3 BIODIVERSITY TRIP

Midwife Booking In Appointments. As soon as you find out you are pregnant, contact a GP or Midwife and they will help you book your first appointment. Your first Midwife appointment (also called the booking appointment) should happen before you are 10 weeks pregnant. This is because you'll be offered some tests that should be done before 10 weeks.

Sensory Room (from birth) sensory lights and equipment to help develop your child's senses. Also for children and young people with SEND aged 0-25 years. 30 minute exclusive slots are available.

Birth Registrations - Please book via Sunderland City Council website. Register a birth, a new born baby must be registered within 42 days of the date of birth. The baby should be registered in the registration district where it was born.

Outside the Lines Play Group for SEND

0-11 years (siblings welcome) For children with a diagnosis or on the pathway, in mainstream, specialist or home educated.
