


SCHOOL COUNCIL COMPETITION WINNERS

MESSAGE FROM NHS IMMUNISATION SERVICE

All parents/carers should have received an email from school regarding immunising children against measles. Here is the letter in case you have missed it

Measles Outbreak

You may have seen in the news that there have been serious outbreaks of Measles over the last few months. Outbreaks are now occurring widely in England, with children being the ones mostly affected. This is because many of them have missed out on the opportunity to have their MMR vaccinations for numerous reasons.

Children are offered 2 MMR vaccinations before they start school. If you think your child has not had both doses and you want them to be vaccinated, please contact the immunisation team on **03333583397**, **option 3**, **option 1** and we can take consent and arrange this for you. **Alternatively, you can contact your own GP**.

Measles cases are rising. There is no specific treatment for Measles and the MMR vaccination gives the best possible protection against illness
