
Day 1.






#### WAGOLL

Why are story plans helpful?






Our story will have 5 parts.

## Day 4

Today, we are going to turn our plan in to the next part of the story?

What main thing do we need to add to turn a plan in to a story? **DETAIL** 

### The Beginning - as soon as he goes inside the box (Set the scene)

Think about how you set the scene. It is almost like a setting description.

Leon fell through the box and hit the floor with a dramatic thud. Carefully, as he got to his feet, he was astonished by what was in front of him...

### The build up - Does he go somewhere that he shouldn't?

This part should lead towards the the Problem.

Leon was drawn to what was hiding in the corner of room. He know that he shouldn't go near it but something inside him was itching to go and see. With care, he took a step closer. Sweat now forming on his head and his heart beginning to pound in his chest...

Today we will finish our stories and focus on the main problem and resolution of what happened to Leon.

**The problem** – Something always going wrong in a story! This is where the main point of your story happens. It's the top of the mountain.

Maybe he finds something

Maybe the inside of the box is dangerous.

Does he need to help someone in danger?

**The Resolution** – How will it get better? Maybe it wont...

This is the part of the story where things start to get better.

Maybe Leon saves the day or someone else might need to save Leon.

Remember, that you have already planned this on your story plan.

The ending - Think about how you want the story to finish Is it a happy ending or a sad ending/
It could also be a cliff hanger.
