Reading

In addition to this, you will also find a comprehension pack (Treasure Island) uploaded onto the school website. This pack has three different levels based on the reading text and the type of questions being asked. Please complete one of them, however, if your child finds the one they have chosen too easy then feel free to try a different level as well.

English

This week for English, you will be doing two pieces of writing based on each of the pictures below. You are to complete this after you have finished the Spelling and Grammar exercises as we want to see you use these tools in your writing.

You can create a story, write a setting description: you get to choose! For most of you, we want to see at least 2 paragraphs for each piece of writing. Remember, to write in a way that makes your grown up not want to put it down when they read it.





Maths

- 1) Practise your times tables every day for 20 minutes – **including the division facts.**
You can practice on IXL (Sections G, H, I and J) or Purple Mash (pick a division game) to hone your division skills.
- 2) Uploaded to the school website, you will find 2 arithmetic tests. In each test, there are two questions based on fractions, we have not yet covered this in class so do not worry if your child doesn't understand it but feel free to challenge them with it!
- 3) Telling the time. On Purple Mash, there are 2Dos for telling the time.
