

Can I use my knowledge of 2 Paint a Picture to create my own art using different techniques?

Time to show off your skills Year 2!

Today you will combine effects by creating an image in 2 Paint a Picture and then clicking the New File button and using that image to enhance your artwork.

5. Continue to create your art.

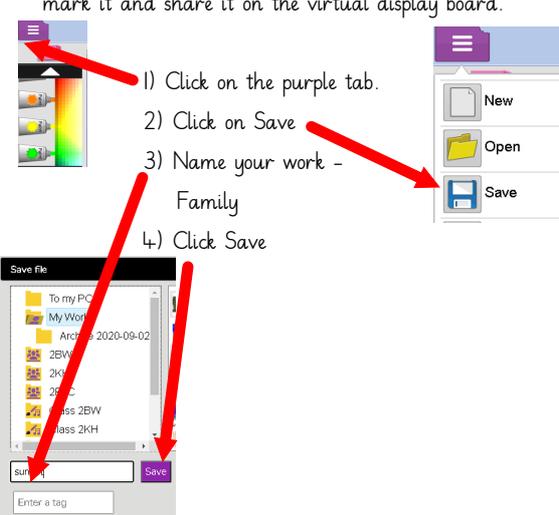
