<p>Spelling Spell correctly most words from the year 5/6 word list.</p> <p>Use a dictionary to check the spelling of uncommon or more ambitious vocabulary..</p> <p>Convert verbs into nouns by adding a suffix.</p> <p>Handwriting Maintain legibility in joined handwriting when writing at speed.</p>	<p>Draft and Write Discuss models of writing, commenting on structure, grammatical features and use of vocabulary.</p> <p>Create a convincing setting, 2 or 3 distinguishable characters and coherent plot with integrated dialogue to convey character and advance action.</p> <p>Write effectively for a range of purposes and audiences, selecting language which shows awareness of reader.</p> <p>Appropriately select grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can enhance meaning and reflect formality:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - contractions in dialogue or first person informal - passive verbs to affect how information is presented. - Modal verbs to suggest degree of certainty. <p>Shift between formality and tense effectively.</p> <p>Edit and Evaluate Suggest improvements to own writing and that of others.</p> <p>Proof read to check for errors in spelling, punctuation and grammar.</p> <p>Check for subject verb agreement when using singular and plural and distinguishing between the language of speech and writing.</p>	<p>Sentence Structure Use passive voice to vary the focus of sentences.</p> <p>Vary sentence length and structure depending on level of formality and genre.</p> <p>Text Structure Organise paragraphs around a theme and use a range of devices to build cohesion across and within paragraphs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - adverbials of time or place - rhetorical question posed and then answered. - topic sentences. - effective use of pronouns and synonyms <p>Use further organisational and presentational devices to structure text and guide reader: E.g. diagrams, bullet points, questions within headings.</p> <p>Use verb tenses consistently and correctly throughout writing.</p> <p>Punctuation Use semi colon and single dash to mark closely related clauses.</p> <p>Use a colon before a list and a semi colon within.</p> <p>Use hyphenated words.</p>
