We continue to develop staff how to use google classroom so that we can best support our pupils learning, in and out of school.


Year 8 and 9 pupils have finished the novel 'Private Peaceful' which is set during WW1. They understand character development and plot structure.

# **Literacy Across Curriculum**

The literacy focus for this term is "sentence structures", all lessons across the curriculum have embedded this into the teaching to help strengthen pupils' ability to vary their sentences.

Reading interventions have been set up using the Dockside set of books; pupils selected have enjoyed reading these so far and the one to one reading is successful. We plan to run small reading groups over future terms.

# **Work Scrutiny**

This terms focus on WS has been pupil feedback and evidence that pupils are recalling information from previous lessons.

This could be demonstrated through starter activities in books as well as verbal questioning observed through Learning Walks.



In addition, this links to literacy and numeracy targets in pupils' books. Pupils, once

mastered a skill, need to be continuously showing that skill in use after the date the target has been met. Similarly, if a target has not been met, and pupils show this later in the term this can be noted and dated. This helps build on pupils' memory and recall skills which are imperative tools for pupils to acquire in order to reach their full potential.

# Teaching and Learning Steering Group across the Trust

At the last T and L meeting the PLT Minimum Service Standards were discussed so that all PLT academies

Are working in the same way to the same schedules and deadlines. This helps to share good practice and experience. This includes WS; LW's; Progress meetings; data drops; moderation both internally and externally; parent and pupil surveys. All dates and information is on one T and L calendar which all academies follow simultaneously.

**Staff CPD**- the needs within the academy around quality of education were discussed and relevant training around speech and language; reading strategies and interventions were highlighted as training to be actioned.

# English Subject Meeting Across the Trust

All English teachers met virtually to discuss the teaching of English and all academies are completing the same AQA English GCSE's. This has made sharing resources; moderation and planning more consistent across PLT.

The terms focus is reading and how this is implemented within English and all subjects; how SOW are sequenced through from KS1-4; a phonics SOW; memory and recall skills and how PDP topics are delivered in English SOW.

Lexia should be used across curriculum and as a side line intervention as opposed to being part of an English lesson and Wrats should be completed within the first ten days of a new pupil entry.

Everyone must be aware of the lowest 20% readers and what is being done differently for these pupils in order to close the gaps.

Primary students have also enjoyed a selection of enrichment activities which have included: weekly swimming sessions on a Monday, many pupils are now able to swim at least one length with most starting with not knowing how to swim. Kickboxing each Monday to build resilience and a positive outlet for managing and regulating their emotions. Basketball each Friday with a focus around relationships and communication, two basketball coaches work with children to develop teamwork and building positive relationships. Football once a week with Southend United football coaches to develop teamwork and resilience.

# **Relationships Presentation**

Our KS4 pupils were involved in a session about healthy relationships and respect, which was delivered by Emma from the street engagement team. The pupils showed great maturity when talking about some tough topics, and really enjoyed group conversations around sexual harassment and misogyny. # Staff have been training on the following:

- -Understand how communication happens and be able to support each aspect of communication development more appropriately
- -Be able to identify pupils with SLCN in a secondary classroom
- -Give pupils time to process information and know why this is important
- -Find it easier to differentiate questions
- -Have strategies to support development of oral and written vocabulary
- -Have tools to develop narrative and report writing for those who find this a challenge
- -Facilitate learning in a classroom which enables pupils to express their ideas and request help appropriately.
- -Understand how to manage pupils with social communication needs more effectively
- -Understand the link between speech and literacy development
