Literacy deserves and demands focus, and Lexia has delivered it. It is a computer programme which has developed a






the vast majority of learners. Lexia's approach is focused on sound methodology, engaging experiences,

and continued acknowledgement of the value of each individual learner. By doing so, this programme is making literacy truly accessible for every pupil, to every need .Each pupil is assessed by the programme and put on their own individual literacy journey based on their needs.

Each pupil is timetabled 3 x 20 minute sessions per week and the summer term has shown an increase in all three areas:

Literacy across the curriculum has shown improvement through pupils' work and


learning walks. The English room has a reading corner with beanbags; carpet and a range of books for

feedback from teachers. Books are well presented and the Marking and Feedback Policy adhered to.


English

Year 10 pupils are currently beginning their GCSE English language preparation ready for year 11. They have studied Romeo and Juliet earlier in the summer term.




Year 9 have been focusing on the play DNA-

Exam Outcomes

As we near the end of the year and with all exams and coursework complete, we have a very good idea of which qualifications and grades our current Year 11 pupils are likely to achieve. This has been the first year since the pandemic that exams have actually taken place! We are predicted that 82.4% (14 out of 17) will achieve at least 5 (9-1 or equivalent GCSEs) qualifications. As well as English and Maths GCSEs, qualifications this year include Applied Science, Art, Hair & Beauty, Occupational Studies, ICT, Personal Wellbeing and Prince's Trust.

The Academy will be open between 9:00am and 11:00am on Thursday 25th August for pupils to collect their exam results.





<u>Maths</u>

Victory Park is now looking at introducing a new online maths learning platform called 'Mathelitics' in the very near future!

Occupational Studies

Pupils have been learning about a broad range of skills from bricklaying, carpentry, painting and decorating as



well as horticulture. Pupils have shown



great levels of engagement and have particularly enjoyed the practical elements. Occupational studies has opened our pupils up to new possibilities and

experiences that we hope will build confidence and expand their options when moving on from VPA. Thanks for all your hard work, farewell to year 11 and look forward to working with the rest of you next year.

Princes Trust

This year in Princes Trust our year 10 and 11 pupils have been working towards gaining their level 2 qualifications. Pupils have been learning about a broad range of skills, from managing money, how to research career options and working as part of a team. Princes Trust has been a great benefit to our pupils as it has given them new skills which will stay with them and help them through life after school. Great work everyone.



<u>Careers</u>

The Careers advice and guidance service at Victory Park has been busy discussing the options open to young people after they leave school.

Students asked about working on constructions sites, careers with children, as well as jobs in the always updating world of technology and the continuously moving logistics industry.

When students talked about "working and learning" we explored apprenticeships and how to create a CV for employers.

As we reach the end of another busy year, 2022 has welcomed many exciting opportunities and experiences for our students at Victory Park. During the year many of our students have worked with Alison our student support, participated in a number of trips, including a successful visit to the farm and engaged well in some of the sports interventions. Cooper our therapy dog has been a welcomed addition to the team and is enjoyed, by both staff and pupils. Many of our students have enjoyed using some of our sensory resources in order to support regulate their feelings and engage in learning.

We have continued to welcome new students into Victory Park along with supporting many of our young people transition back to their mainstream school or access alternative provisions.

Primary

This term primary students enjoyed



watching ducklings hatch from eggs in an incubator. Once hatched pupils were able to handle them and even watch them swim! One student said



to an adult "this is an awesome experience!" As well as having the ducks students have enjoyed their enrichment

activities including basketball, swimming, kickboxing and football.

As part of their animals topics both primary classes enjoyed a trip to Barley lands Farm. As part of their visit they got to feed a calve, a kid and hold chicks and ducklings. They also had a farmer's tour to see all of the



animals and visited the nocturnal animals area.



In our KS1 group there has been a focus around phonics and the introduction of read write inc. The children have enjoyed learning new sounds and using Fred talk to help them.

We even have our own Fred frog in class. For those children who have learnt their

phonic sounds we have focussed on spellings and learning



them in different ways including using magnetic letters and the chalkboard in class.



In our KS2 group children have enjoyed learning about Fantastic Mr Fox in

English and enjoyed roleplaying as the character to answer questions about his crimes. Whilst over in Science children have enjoyed learning about how light is reflected in mirror by playing mirror games including walking along a wavy line only using the mirror to guide them.

Reading

Reading has continued to be a big focus at VPA. In our KS 1 and 2 classes, reading for pleasure takes place every day and in The Harbour a text is used to support many aspects of English. Primary staff have been receiving additional training in phonics this term and are looking forward to teaching the next stage of our phonics 304 644 Into@victorypark.org.uk programme from the start of next school year.

In KS3 and 4 there has been a continued focus on ensuring that reading is a big part of the curriculum and that it becomes the gateway to learning. Our learning walks for Summer 1 and 2 show that 75% of lessons were graded as at least strong when we looked at reading being prioritised to allow pupils to access the full curriculum offer and reading materials being closely matched to ability. Our book scrutinies in Summer 1 and 2 show that 92% of work monitored was graded at least strong when we checked that reading is prioritised to allow pupils to access the full curriculum offer.

We aim to have more areas in our KS3 and 4 classrooms for pupils to read for pleasure and we already have purchased books after consulting with pupils. The English room has a comfortable and attractive reading area and pupils enjoy using it.

Pupils' views of reading :

Harry (7) likes reading Peppa Pig books and thinks his reading has got better at VPA because he reads every day and gets extra help from staff. He likes the pictures in Peppa Pig books. When Harry goes back to his mainstream school his teachers have noticed a difference in his reading. Well done Harry!

Cameron (13) loves reading -especially Diary of the Wimpy Kid -he has nearly read all of them and he likes the humour. Cameron enjoys both fiction and non-fiction books. He says that books keep him entertained. Cameron has said that he could read five books a week !


Applied Science

- More vegan/vegetarian meals in our school dinner menu



<u>STAG</u>

The summer term arrived and the beginning of the new Secondary Turnaround Group (STAG). They have settled in and I'm happy to say, enjoying the opportunities they have been given in Basketball, Football, Food Technology and Combat Academy, where they have develop their personal skillset further in many different ways.

As well their classwork in English, Maths, PHSE and Personal Development, a session per week as part of the Curriculum at Southend Combat Academy where a team of highly trained instructors under the calm guidance of Simon are working on their Health, Fitness and Nutrition. Teaching and Learning

All subjects have had meetings with other academies across the Trust in order to plan and share good practice. Teachers find



these particularly useful as it allows teachers to discuss new ideas and

amend planning. Resources are dropped into folders on Microsoft 360 so everyone can view or use these.

Within VPA, we have reviewed the curriculum for 2022-2023. The key purposes of the review are to decide what worked, what didn't work and what needs to be amended. It's to enhance pupil learning, engagement, experience and outcomes. In addition, it improves communication and collaboration between staff, leading to a stronger programme team ethos which filters down to our pupils.

As a result, VPA will have a secondary STAG class whereby pupils are on a 12 week programme plus a separate nurture

group (Carousel) managed by our Deputy Senco which will be located in different part of the academy. The Carousel group



will be focussing on Personal Development, Life skills, communication, literacy and numeracy.

Learning walks have taken place so we can collect evidence about teaching and learning, evidence of progress and areas for the academy development. Within these, other subject teachers are able to hold academic conversations with pupils about their learning experiences. They are intended to be developmental and constructive rather than judgemental, and are a whole-school teaching and learning improvement activity. Learning Walks



recorded have shown good teaching practice across the curriculum including providing reading opportunities for

pupils in lessons.
