THIS WEEK

Fire, Evacuation and Lockdown Drills

You may have heard that we have carried out a number of fire drills, lockdown drills and evacuation drills over the last couple of weeks. The school is required by Government to regularly hold these drills. The purpose of a school lockdown is to protect the children and adults in the building from a potential emergency. As with fire drills and other safety programs, the hope is to prepare pupils and teachers to a procedure that they will be able to follow quickly, effectively, and safely. We are unable to inform parents and children in advance as it would not be an effective drill. Class teachers explained the drills and the announcement across the school also makes sure it is a drill not the real thing. Less dramatic examples are given to the children to explain the lockdown for example an animal escaping the zoo or helicopter landing on the school field as this is a good way to explain why a lockdown or evacuation might occur. Please encourage your children to talk to their class teacher if they have concerns. The children did well in all the drills that have taken place this term, remaining calm and walking sensibly in and out of the building.

- The cards are professionally printed and returned to school in early December.

Artwork guidelines

- Bold, colourful designs look great - use a brightly coloured piece of paper as your starting point.
- A border works well, as the designs may be trimmed in the printing process. Try coloured paper or a ribbon. Important details must not be placed within 5mm of the edge of the paper.
- Please read the artwork guidelines printed in your child's order form - most art materials can be used, but colouring pencils, white or silver on a white background and photographs are not recommended.
- Please circle the arrow on the form to show which way up your picture goes.
- Please keep designs flat and damage free, as marks will show on the final print.

Secondary outcomes will be sent by post or email. If you applied online, you will receive an email in the evening with the outcome and you can also view your school offer online. If you registered for ParentComm, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.

By 15 March 2023
You must confirm whether you wish to accept or decline the place you have been offered.

By 29 March 2023
If you wish to appeal for a community school listed on your form, you should submit it by this date so that it can be heard by 15 June 2023. Other schools may have different appeal deadlines.

If your child was born between 1 September 2011 and 31 August 2012 you will need to apply for a secondary school place by 31 October 2022.
