## HEAD'S UPDATE



**Welcome Meetings:** It was so lovely to see the Year 5 and Year 6 parents and carers this week at the welcome meetings. Lots of information about the exciting trips the children have ahead of them and the increased expectations were talked about and they were lived streamed for those who could not attend in person. The next opportunity meeting up is the year group tea parties! I look forward to seeing you then.

**New Children:** The Year 3 have been settling in very quickly and have adjusted to the extra responsibility and independence we promote at junior school very well. We have had a number of new children starting this year in the other year groups and they have done very well - some joining School Council, others getting headteacher awards already and the majority very swiftly establishing strong friendship groups. It has been wonderful to see them settling in so well and the other children have all been exceptionally supportive and kind to them to make them feel welcome.

**Yoga Club:** We are starting a Yoga club - especially aimed at sensitive and anxious children to build up their strength and relieve stress. Yoga is an ancient practice from India over 5,000 years ago - a special assembly this Friday was held to help explain what yoga is all about. Spaces in the club still for the children to sign up to. **Bank Holiday Monday:** The Government has announced that Monday 19th September will be a national bank holiday to allow individuals, businesses, and other organisations to pay their respects to Her Majesty and commemorate her reign, while marking the final day of the period of national mourning. We had a minute of silence on Friday 9th September and teachers have had assemblies and discussions with the children regarding this historically significant event and discussing thoughts and feelings on this topic. School will be closed.

**Reviewing and Reducing Uniform Costs:** During this financial crisis and with energy costs set to rise significantly we are all under increasing pressure financially and so we have been reviewing our

school uniform policy and looking at ways of reducing the cost to be as low as possible. We are looking at alternative materials and the use of more non branded items. We are also holding more regular used uniform sales where uniform can be bought at a very low cost. The next sale is 3.15pm - 3.45pm next Thursday 22nd September and will be on the island outside the main gate. Thanks to the PTA for running this. ### Unauthorised Absence

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not need to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. ## YEAR 3 REMINDERS



### Year 3 Homework

Year 3 homework will begin next week (starting 19th September 2022).

On Mondays, Spelling Shed and Times Table Rock Stars will be set. The children will be set 3 games on each site to complete. These games can either be completed in 1 x 30 minute session or 3 x 10 minute session.

Mathletics will be set on Wednesday. The children will have 1 task to do - known as a 'quest' on the site.

The children are expected to read at least 3 times a week and this should be noted in their Reading Records.

In school, the children have spent time logging on to Chromebooks and practising accessing and having a go on all the sites. They should therefore be familiar with the homework at home as they

### Bikeability

Each child in Year 6 is given the opportunity to take part in the Bikeability Training Scheme, which replaces Cycling Proficiency. After an initial talk by the Surrey Instructors the children will be taken in groups to cycle on the local roads avoiding main roads.

The training will take place from either **week commencing 3rd or 10th October 2022 during the school day** and each course will include a maximum of 9 children. The course is run by **Surrey County Council** so you will need to enrol and pay using the following:

There is a charge of £15.00 per child for the training. Children who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) should pay £4 and I will send a discount code to relevant parent/carers in a separate email.

You will need to pay on the link above not via Scopay. When you finish enrolling, you should receive a confirmation email from Surrey County Council cycle training team. Please note that **enrolment closes on Friday 23rd September 2022.**

Your child will be allocated to one of the courses by the school, after which you will receive a further email giving your dates and times.

Please let the class teacher or school office know as soon as possible **if your child is unable to participate at a particular time**, due to a medical or dental appointment, so that the groups can be organised accordingly.

The children will receive a report at the end of the week outlining their strengths and weaknesses, to assist them in improving their road skills.

Please take time to ensure your child's bicycle and helmet is in good working order and to encourage your child to practice over the next few weeks.

Secondary outcomes will be sent by post or email. If you applied online, you will receive an email in the evening with the outcome and you can also view your school offer online. If you registered for **ParentComms**, you will also receive a notification with the outcome.

### By 15 March 2023

You must confirm whether you wish to accept or decline the place you have been offered.

### By 29 March 2023

If you wish to appeal for a community school listed on your form, you should submit it by this date so that it can be heard by 15 June 2023. Other schools may have different appeal deadlines.

## Is your child in year 6?

If your child was born between 1 September 2011 and 31 August 2012 you will need to apply for a secondary school place by **31 October 2022**.

# Parenting Help and Support

## Tips for Supporting Children in Dealing with Grief

### Tips for Supporting Children in DEALING WITH GRIEF

It's important that trusted adults feel able to help children and young people cope with grief – particularly at the moment, when we are a nation mourning the loss of a public figure who was treasured by so many. Children are seeing bereavement and sadness being featured heavily in the national news and in their favourite online spaces, and hearing it being talked about extensively among families and in the community. How can we help them in processing this healthily?

- 1 UNDERSTAND WHAT GRIEF IS**  
Grief is emotional distress which is a normal response to the death of someone close, well known or admired. It may feel overwhelming – especially for young people – and is often accompanied by feelings of shock, disbelief, anger or fear. These emotions may also mean that sleep, eating and our relationships with others could be affected.
- 2 MEET THE CHILD 'WHERE THEY ARE'**  
This could be a child's first experience of grief and loss – or conversely, they may have already encountered it several times. Make sure that any conversations you have with them, and the support that you give, are led by their experiences and their understanding of death – and in the context of their religious or community beliefs.
- 3 EXPLAIN CLEARLY WHAT DEATH IS**  
It may often feel uncomfortable, but it's healthier to actually use the words "dead", "death" or "died". Abstract explanations of death can frequently create even more confusion – particularly for younger children, who are still trying to grasp this complex (and possibly unfamiliar) concept.
- 4 BE PREPARED FOR QUESTIONS**  
On subjects such as this – especially when it involves a person who's well known to them – children and young people often have lots of questions, all at once. Sometimes, new queries about the issue will occur to them weeks after the event. Be ready to answer their questions as honestly as you can, using language that's appropriate for their age.
- 5 FIND WAYS TO REMEMBER THEM**  
It can help to talk to about the person who's died, even if that individual wasn't personally involved in the child's own life – such as a significant public figure, for instance. You and your child can discuss what that person meant to you, celebrate the things they achieved or go to a place where they can be remembered.
- 6 ENCOURAGE COPING STRATEGIES**  
You can help a child or young person to identify what their usual positive ways of coping are when they have overwhelming feelings. For example, do they find that talking with someone, drawing, going for a walk or listening to music help when they're feeling upset? These same activities could form an important part of the grieving process.
- 7 REACH OUT FOR SUPPORT**  
If a child or young person is struggling with grief to the extent that it's impacting on their everyday life, there are lots of expert organisations that you could reach out to for further help. Samaritans provides a listening ear for anyone in emotional distress; The Mix offers specialist support to people under 25; and Winston's Wish deals specifically with helping young people who are grieving.

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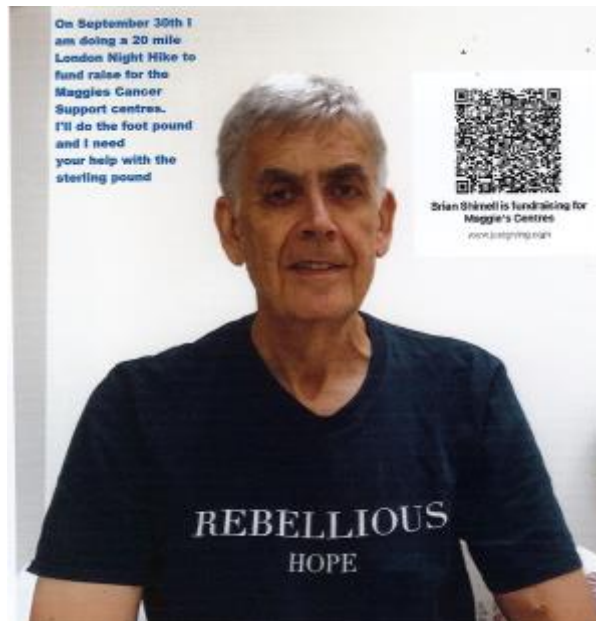
