- **Initials** - Please enter the initials you would like to be printed on the FRONT of the hoodie. There is a maximum of 4 characters and it will be printed in capitals.

Please make sure you press the order button where you will be directed to the payment page (please make sure you enter all the required information). The order is not complete until payment has been successful.

Passports

All children will be required to use their own passport for the French Trip. If you need to apply for a passport, please do so in plenty of time. Please note current UK passports must be at the time of travel: • Less than 10 years old • Valid for at least 3 months after the day we leave France. You will need to send in your child's passport to the school office by Tuesday 6th June 2023.

EHIC or GHIC

All children will require either a valid in-date European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC). If your child's EHIC is out of date then you should apply for a GHIC (Global Health Insurance Card). You may apply for a GHIC up to 6 months before your EHIC expires. Applying for a GHIC is free of charge on the NHS website. Beware of unofficial websites that charge you a fee to apply. Please ensure you apply for this in plenty of time.

Year 3 Trips and Visitors 2023

During the Academic year, the Year 3 pupils are given the opportunity to attend a number of trips and participate in a variety of talks and activities to complement and extend their classroom studies. In the summer term we have planned a trip to Butser Ancient Farm and to Painshill Park.

- **On 27th April 2023** we will go on a day trip to **Butser Ancient Farm**, Hampshire, to enhance their work in the classroom and discover more about the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. The trip will involve the children actively learning about their history topic by completing an archaeological excavation, having a site tour and experiencing some activities that would have happened in the Stone Age including chalk carving.
- On Thursday 22nd June 2023 we are visiting Painshill Park to support science studies on green plants. The children will have a guided activity called 'Plant Explorers' and have the opportunity to look around Painshill Park.

To cover the cost we must ask for a voluntary contribution of **£54 per child**, which must be paid via the Scopay website. Helping children and young people with MANAGING DEVICE STRESS AND ANXIETY

The internet and advances in the capability of digital devices have afforded us arguably the fastest period of technological and social evolution in living memory, creating opportunities for us to interact with people anywhere in the world, 24 hours a day. It's also, however, blurred safety boundaries and added new stresses for young people, who are often less aware of the hidden hazards. With almost half of 10-16-year-olds experiencing bullying online and algorithms pushing content in front of our children every day, it's important to know how to address some of these challenges.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

LIVING ONLINE

The internet is awash with opportunities and information that can help our children and young people to thrive. But it can also be a source of stress and anxiety. Content can be overwhelming, and it's important to ensure that our children and young people have the skills to manage their online experience.

DIGITAL DEPENDENCY

As devices allow access to information and entertainment, it's easy to become hooked. This can lead to a loss of interest in other activities, and a reliance on devices for entertainment and social interaction.

PUSHY NOTIFICATIONS

Constant alerts directed at us through notifications from our smartphones or tablets can be a source of stress. It's important to manage these notifications and ensure that they don't become a distraction.

DISGUISED DISTRESS

Children often haven't yet developed the emotional resilience to deal with the pressures of everyday life. It's important to be aware of the signs of distress and to provide support when needed.

BLURRED BOUNDARIES

There are few clear boundaries between the online and offline worlds. This can lead to a loss of focus and a sense of being overwhelmed.

ANTI-SOCIAL SOCIALS

Social media can be a source of stress and anxiety. It's important to be aware of the risks and to provide support when needed.


