I also asked them what they would like to change at the school and they said:

- Nothing
- Longer school days
- Pupils who ate school dinners and those with packed lunches should sit together
- Longer half term
- Drama as a subject
- The boy's toilet cubicle locks don't work
- More plant life and a bird watching area
