School Uniform Policy

We are proud of our uniform at Wallace Fields Junior School. It is practical, smart and helps to give the children a sense of belonging. WINTER UNIFORM LIST – From October half term until Easter

- Grey shorts, grey trousers, grey knee-length skirt or grey pinafore
- White shirt or blouse
- Red V-neck pullover or red cardigan
- Grey or white ankle socks, or grey, black or red tights
- Black Shoes (sensible no fashion shoes or boots)

SUMMER UNIFORM LIST – Easter until October half term

- Grey shorts, grey trousers, grey knee-length skirt or red and white gingham print dress.
- White shirt or Polo shirt with school logo
- Red V-neck pullover or red cardigan
- Grey or white ankle socks, Grey, black or red tights
- Black shoes (sensible no fashion shoes or sandals)
- School tie (unless wearing gingham dress)

<u>PE KIT</u>

- Red shorts with school logo
- White T-shirt with school logo
- Red sweatshirt with school logo
- Plain black, grey or navy track suit bottoms for winter months
- White socks
- Plimsolls (optional)
- Trainers

OTHER UNIFORM

Hair

Hair must be off the face and no extremes of hair (spiky/Mohican/shaved patterns). Long hair must be tied back with a band or scrunchie or held back with an Alice band. No hair dyes permitted apart from natural shades (some colourful hair permitted for charity days i.e. Comic Relief). Hair gel and hair sprays are not permitted. Nail varnish and make up are not permitted.

Earrings

Pupils are only allowed one pierced gold/silver stud earring in each ear and earrings cannot be worn during P.E. If your child is unable to remove their earrings they will not be allowed to participate in P.E. We recommend that children do not wear their earrings on the day they have P.E. or Games. Parents must, therefore, decide at the beginning of the summer holidays if they wish to have their child's ears pierced. This will give enough time for the ears to heal and for the removal of earrings. We do not put plasters over earrings as this does not negate the health and safety issues and is not practical during PE preparation.

Jewellery

Jewellery is not permitted at school. Children who need to wear bracelets or necklaces to alert others to their medical condition in cases of emergency are to remove them temporarily for P.E. (unless they are wearing a sports medic-alert bracelet), and give them to their class teacher as these items can be a source of potential injury in games or practical activities.

Watches & Health Tracker Watches

Watches are also removed for PE & games. A simple cheap analogue watch is recommended in order to promote the learning of time (rather than digital watches). Fancy watches and health tracker watches can be a distraction and we would like to discourage children from wearing high cost items in school. The school takes no responsibility for these items in school and they remain the responsibility of the wearer.

Nail varnish and make up

Nail varnish and make up are not permitted.
