REPORTS AND SATS RESULTS

Reports were emailed out to all parents/carers today by class teachers. National Test results (SATs) were handed out in envelopes to Year 6 children. Below is a summary of the schools National Test results. The Year 6 have done extremely well considering the impact of the pandemic and the lost learning. They have worked tremendously hard and with a high percentage of special educational needs (25% SEND) we are very proud of their achievement. The year group have achieved results above the national average in **all** subjects. There were a few children who did not take the test because they were working below the level of the tests. These children are included in the percentages. Well done Year 6 and thanks to all the teaching staff in all year groups for their efforts in securing excellent progress across the four years they were with us – including the online learning

HEAD'S UPDATE

HEAT WAVE PRECAUTIONS

There are very high temperatures predicted for Monday and Tuesday (18th - 19th July 2022). The children's comfort and safety is a priority in school so please ensure your child is wearing the summer uniform on these days if possible. Advise your child not to wear a jumper (oddly, these are still being worn on hot days) and that they have a labelled water bottle with them. Ties are optional on these days and sunscreen should be pre-applied before school. A small tube of sunscreen is permissible and can be applied during breaks only. The children will be kept as comfortable as possible and some of the planned curriculum may be adjusted to activities that are more appropriate. The heat is difficult to work in and so at times the same expectations may not be applied. **Many lessons will move outside to the shade.** The children will spend most of their lunchtime sitting down in the shade and they will be constantly reminded to drink lots and limit their running around. Thank you for your cooperation with this. **DfE are not advising schools to close.**

OFSTED PARENT RESPONSES

It was lovely to talk to so many of you at sports day and at the gate about the Ofsted inspection report. Many of you are angry at the grading and believe we are outstanding, and it has been lovely to hear your thoughts and to see how passionately you support the school.

Many have asked if they can complain formally about the Ofsted as you feel the grading is unfair and wrong. I should explain that a couple of weeks after the inspection I got the draft inspection. They then allow me to send 'factual errors' for correction and I did send number of corrections about it. They did not change very many and obviously the grading remained the same. I can complain about the inspection but the consequence is that they could carry out another (slightly shorter) inspection to verify the previous inspection's findings. Ofsted need to guard their integrity and so almost inevitably we would have had the same outcome. I know of other schools locally who have tried to complain to no avail. Ofsted do say very clearly that *"We will not normally consider a complaint about an inspection (or any other action we have taken) from a third party who is not directly involved, such as a parent or other user of the service. This is because we do not explain our inspection/regulatory findings to third parties, other than by publishing our reports or outcomes."*

I must state emphatically that I did not want to put the staff through that traumatic and draining process again and so I did not complain. It was very clear that some of you feel that there was an agenda and with 30% of Surrey schools currently outstanding they must downgrade at least 2 out of every 3 they inspect – irrespective of them actually being outstanding.

I appreciate your comments though I am keen to move on and we need to put this subjective and short report behind us. We are the same school now as we were before the visit. Your children remain our highest priority and we continue to educate them as enthusiastically and as professionally as ever. Thank you again for your support and your words of appreciation.
