Emotionally Based School Non-Attendance (EBSNA): Parent Training and Support



Training aims

This training aims to develop the understanding, skills and confidence of parents supporting children and young people (CYP) experiencing EBSNA by:

- Understanding what EBSNA is and what contributes to it
- Developing a toolkit of strategies to support wellbeing and attendance
- Creating a forum for peer support with other parents experiencing EBSNA.

What do we mean by EBSNA?

Difficulty attending school due to emotional factors which can manifest as anxiety and, in some cases, result in prolonged periods of absence from school.

Who is the training for?

This training is for parents of children and young people who are finding attendance to school difficult. They may be showing the following behaviours:

- · Expressing worries about school
- School attendance with stress and pleas for non-attendance
- · Repeated behaviours in the morning to avoid school
- · Repeated lateness in the morning followed by attendance
- Periodic absences or skipping of classes
- · Repeated absences or skipping of classes
- · Repeated absences or skipping of classes mixed with attendance
- · Complete absence from school during a certain period of time/parts of the day

Please note that, at this time, this training and support is not suitable for parents of children who have been absent from school for an extended period of time. We hope to further develop our offer in this area over time.
