"Welcome to another blog. This week, each year group will be taking part in a sponsored walk/run. Each class is running a certain distance varying from class to class.

The school is doing this specific event for 1. raising money for comic relief and 2. For buying more Chromebooks. The first £278 will go to comic relief and any extra money raised will go towards Chromebooks. The Chromebooks cost about £330 while the charging points are a whopping £800! The school requires 68 more Chromebooks for every child to have one!

Year 3 will have to run 116 miles as a year group, year 4 will have to complete 128 miles, year 5 have to do 140 miles and year 6 need to run/walk 152 miles to ensure all money can be raised for the school and comic relief.

We need as many people to donate, as much money as possible, so that our school can afford the expensive Chromebooks for our target so that we can have all the Chromebooks we need.

Our school is thankful for all the fantastic running that has been taking place between all of the year groups and we would like to say thank you. LATERAL FLOW TESTS FOR FAMILIES

If you're a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of a school pupil, college student or of a staff member, you can get twice-weekly symptom-free tests. The symptom-free tests for households are not available from schools or colleges. Households can get a test by booking an appointment online at a symptomfree testing site, or by collecting a home-testing kit from a designated collection point, or if unable to travel to a site, by ordering a kit online.
