#### SUMMER UNIFORM

The uniform will change to be summer uniform after the Easter break. For more information about our uniform policy <u>click here</u> but to summarise from Easter until October half term children can wear the Summer uniform which is as follows:-

- Grey shorts, grey trousers, grey knee-length skirt or red and white gingham print dress.

#### COVID UPDATE – 1<sup>st</sup> APRIL 2022

On Tuesday 29 March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the next steps for living with COVID-19 in England from Friday 1 April. The key updated guidance is as follows:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days

#### **RESIDENTIAL TRIP PAYMENT REMINDERS:**


If your child is going on a child's residential trip, please do not forget to pay on Scopay the final installment:


