PENALTY NOTICES FOR UNAUTHORISED LEAVE

A full copy of our Attendance Policy is available on our website. The Education Welfare Service, acting on behalf of SCC may issue a Penalty Notice as an alternative to the prosecution of a Parent / Carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school and requires the recipient to pay a fixed amount. If a child is taken out of

school for more than 5 days / 10 sessions, unauthorised leave, (this need not be consecutive) without the authorisation of the school, the amount payable on issue of a Penalty Notice is £60 per parent per child. This rises to £120 if paid after the 21 days period, but within 28 days. If not paid, legal action will be taken against the recipient for the period shown on the penalty notice, the local authority, Surrey County Council must prosecute the Parent / Carer for failing to ensure regular school attendance under Section 444 Education Act 1996. Please read the Attendance Policy to ensure you understand the criteria for unauthorised absence and its implications.

CLEAN AIR CAMPAIGN / PARKING CAMPAIGN

There is a growing problem of poor parking after school.

- Parking on double yellow lines blocking the view on the corners and putting lives at risk
- Parking on verges which damages the grass and blocks the road for wider vehicles such as fire engines
- Leaving engines running causing pollution and particulates – this cause harm to children more than adults
- Inconsiderate parking blocking driveways and using people's drives to turn around.

PLEASE PARK WITH CARE!

DEFIBRILLATOR

A reminder that there is a fully functioning defibrillator in the medical area in the office. This is available to the general public for office hours and for any incident that may occur in school.

COVID RISING

The level of Covid is rising in the area. The 'Living with Covid' Government advice remains the same including staying at home for three days for children and five days for adults. If a child is feeling sick/unwell then they need to rest and get better. If a child is feeling better but is isolating then we will provide remote learning. Please email the class teacher if your child requires remote learning and they will set it up in Google classroom with 24 hours notice. In the meantime please encourage your child to do Times Tables Rockstars, Spelling Shed, Mathletics and reading.

YR 5: HANNAH AND ESME - 23. 5, DOMINIC, ALESSANDRO AND NOAH – 23




