To celebrate children's mental wellbeing week, in the w/c 1^{st} February, we are promoting a wellbeing off screen day. Further details to come.


WELL BEING

INTERVENTIONS

Teachers and teaching assistants have been doing an amazing job running live interventions online across the school including reading, maths, spelling and writing. Intervention helps to support children in their learning and having watched intervention groups in action I have seen how much they enjoy time working with their teachers. If your child has been invited to take part in an intervention, it is really important that they make the time, or remember to attend. Please could you encourage them to attend and set an alarm or reminder so that they do not forget. If they continue to not attend, the place could be offered to someone else or the intervention may cease to be offered to all of the children.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS SUPPORT

For children, who are finding the amount of reading difficult while home learning, you can use assistive technology from Google Chrome to support them. When working in Google Chrome you can download an extension in Chrome called Read aloud Text to Speech Voice Reader that will read text that you highlight. While working on a Chrome book you can access the text to speech feature following the instructions here.

SHARING DEVICES OR HAVING PC ISSUES?

We appreciate remote learning is not easy at home with some children having to sharing devices. We have just received eight more devices from the DfE so we may be able to help a few more families. Priority will obviously go to vulnerable, or critical worker families.

SOCIAL MEDIA GUIDANCE FOR PARENTS

Given the current climate, we hope that all parents are starting to see that we are striving even harder to promote positive and constructive communication **between home and school** – possibly in a way that has never been needed or required before. We therefore, strongly encourage parents to email us directly, if there are any concerns to report. In these times of extreme anxiety, anything posted in social media groups, should be carefully considered and thought about for example in a school-related WhatsApp groups. Please follow this link to our Social Media Expectations document, which will now form part of our Home School Agreement. Following, are the questions we encourage our children to think about before posting anything in a group setting, e.g. in their Google Class streams and we would now ask parents to consider their own usage, also using these questions:-

- 1. Why am I posting this? Does it reflect my personality and values?
- 2. Would I say this, like this, in person?
- 3. Can this be interpreted differently by the reader/s?
- 4. Am I being kind?
- 5. Is this really a 'private' space to share my worries/ideas or concerns?
- 6. Do I have permission to share this information?
- 7. Would I like me? (If I were a stranger reading this, what would I think?)


