IMPORTANT

STAGGERED START AND END TIMES

We have worked together with Wallace Fields Infant School to endeavour that these new timings accommodate any parents with children in both schools as much as possible. We are still awaiting the finalised government guidance for September, however we are mindful of the possibility of an increase in infection rates in the Autumn term. Therefore in order to minimise the possibility of further Covid-19 outbreaks, which would be a risk to the school remaining open, we are keeping an element of a staggered start for both schools; and we are sure you will agree there will be benefits in terms of traffic congestion and parking at what are busy times of the school day. Please see below for the new staggered timings for school drop off and pick up:

- Lower school (Yr 3 &4) 8.40am drop off and 3.25pm pick up
- Upper school (Year 5 & 6) 8.45am drop off and 3.30pm pick up.

CLUBS IN SEPTEMBER

We are delighted to welcome back in September over twenty different extra curriculum clubs at Wallace Fields Junior School including a new and exciting Rock Bands club led by our new Music Teacher and a Survival Super Squad with drawing and other activities with an Ecochildren's book author. ABSENCE PENALTY NOTICE REMINDER

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not need to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

EXTRA LONG OCTOBER HALF TERM

We have just been informed by Surrey Schools that we will be **shut on Friday 22**nd **October** which is the day immediately before the October half-term. This is in lieu of this additional bank holiday to celebrate the Jubilee which falls in the summer half-term break.
