# **HEAD'S UPDATE**

Another very active week with the design and technology projects in many classes and creating new recipes,

proofing and baking going on.
The sporting events with other schools are returning as confidence returns to schools locally. The school routines have been modifying slowly



back to the pre-Covid times and the children are enjoying more outdoor learning with the improved weather. The field is open for lunchtimes now and soon our outdoor learning spaces will be booked up for lessons.

<u>Covid Update</u> – Covid numbers rose last week and this had an impact on attendance of both pupils and staff. We had 20% of teachers out and 30% the week before. There was a peak of 21 children last week however, numbers dropped to 10 this week so we will be returning to whole school assemblies.

Covid Impact on School: This level of Covid has had an impact on school in that we had to provide cover for lessons and this in turn effects intervention and support in lessons. I would like to thank the staff for their incredible flexibility, commitment and energy in providing additional support and covering groups. Special thanks go to Mrs Hallet, Mrs Fowler, Mrs Langner and Mrs Wilson although this is not a complete list as all staff have adapted extremely well including teaching assistants and SNAs and we have managed to keep classes running smoothly. Whilst it may seem that the rest of society is returning to

normal, inside school we still abide by guidance from the DfE, which includes testing and isolation, and this is very difficult as staff levels become critical. In addition to this, there have been chest infections and respiratory sickness affecting the teachers, the caretaker and the administration staff. Mr Findlay is never off sick so that was a surprise.

I would also like to thank parents and carers for your ongoing patience and understanding of the situation in school. Whilst we have not suffered as much as other nearby schools we have had to drop several focus and intervention groups.

Peer on Peer Abuse: As a school, we are acutely aware of the need to ensure that all the children are safe. Part of this goal includes acting on peer on peer abuse or harassment including sexually inappropriate behaviour or touching. All peer on peer abuse is recorded and investigated fully and although more prevalent in later stages of education, children at primary age are still a concern – especially if they have experienced issues at home or witnessed or suffered inappropriate behaviour. This is soon to be renamed 'child on child abuse' and we continue to track it across the whole school. We use PSHE lessons to ensure awareness of self and the 'pant rule' that helps children with identifying incidences of inappropriate touching and the occurrence of others acting without consent. We continue to teach and model healthy and happy relationships and what to do if a relationship is no longer happy or healthy. We will contact parents if we investigate any incidences of peer on peer abuse and often involve the parents of both the victim and the perpetrator.

Pick Up from School: We have updated procedure for pick up from school. The details are attached. Please come closer to the school gates and note that children will not be released to parents and carers unless they are the school side of the road, within sight and a short distance away. Parents and children including siblings should remain gate-side of the island as the barrier demarcates where traffic is exiting and entering the school – including staff and visitors. Please drive carefully, park respectfully and put the safety of the children first by not turning in the road, blocking the road or using the local residents' driveways. Your cooperation and modelling of courteous behaviour is very much appreciated and goes a long way in ensuring the children behave appropriately in the future.

# **REMINDERS**

### **WATER BOTTLES PLEASE!**

As the weather gets warmer. Please do not forget to send your child into school with a clearly labelled water bottle. We do not provide cups as they are single use plastic and as an eco-school we discourage their use.

#### **CLUBS AFTER EASTER**

#### HELP PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID

- Please remain vigilant to symptoms and keep your child at home if they complain of feeling unwell.
- Please test regularly with a lateral flow device (LFD) until your child feels better, as it sometimes takes a while for the test to indicate positive.

- A positive LFD is a sufficient indicator of positive Covid and a PCR test is not required.
- Please let the school office know if your child is unwell and if your child has tested positive or negative on LFD.
- Pupils who have Covid-19 should not attend school whilst they are infectious. Instead they should remain at home and avoid contact with others and remote learning will be provided from their second day of isolation, for a maximum of 10 days. See the useful flow chart about how your child could return earlier if they have two negative Covid tests.
- If a pupil is a close contact of someone with Covid, or if a member of your household has Covid, pupils are expected to continue to attend school. However we would ask that if possible, the child minimises their contact with the person who is infected and you remain particularly vigilant to symptoms and take regular lateral flow tests.


