OFSTED RESULTS

A massive thank you to all those parents who have spoken to me (at sports day and at the main gate recently) and or written emails regarding the Ofsted inspection and the subsequent report. I have been overwhelmed with the incredibly complimentary and enthusiastic response and I have witnessed many parent's disappointment over the loss of the higher grade despite writing to Ofsted that your feeling was that we are an outstanding school. Many parents are surprised that Ofsted recognised the vast array of amazing things the school does in the report and yet graded us as good.

We are the same school now as we were before the inspection. In your feedback to Ofsted via the survey, the response was overwhelmingly positive. You said many extremely honest and supportive things about the school and in the free text section, you recognised how the school goes above and beyond to ensure your child is having a great experience. Your appreciation of the effort the staff put in to ensure children reach their potential was bursting through the written comments. You noticed that it graded good in areas such as behaviour and attitudes and personal development - even though there were no improvement points. The new model only requires one improvement point to reduce the overall grading. If you do want to pass on any more thanks and support to the staff then please do email the office. We can pass on your verbal feedback, as reading your comments is a real tonic for everyone. Thank you.

SPORTS DAY

It was so good to be able to hold a full Sports Day yesterday after two years of stripped-down versions. The weather was fair and the children were all completely up for our biggest competition of the year, helped along by Mr. Lee on the mic, geeing them all up!
