Lower School Players for Children v Adults Football

Thank you to all the Upper School parents and children who took part on Thursday 9th November 2023. Next week is the Lower School event. Teams have now been selected and will be announced on the assembly on Monday.

Parent / Teacher Consultation Meetings

The booking system for making appointments has now closed and parents have been sent a reminder of their appointment time.

Just a few reminders before the parents evenings next week:

Monday 13th November 3.45pm - 6.15pm - face to face in the school hall.

- Parents should arrive and enter the school hall via the playground / library corridor. Access will be via the main gate only.
- Please wait in the library corridor until two minutes before your appointment time. A member of staff will greet parents at the hall and allow access.
- A bell rings to mark the next allotted time slot. Please leave via the quad and main office door (press green button).

Tuesday 14th November 2023 3.45pm - 6.30pm - online video conferencing.

- On the day of the parents' video consultation, to access your video appointments you will need to login to https://wallacefieldsjunior.schoolcloud.co.uk/ and one hour prior to your first appointment, a *Join Video Appointments* button will appear. Please click on this button and the SchoolCloud software will automatically take you to your teacher appointment without the need to dial-in for each individual appointment. Again, a full guide on how to make video appointments is attached.
- It is preferred that children do not attend.

How to attend your appointments via video call

1. Log in and go to the Evening

On the day of the video appointments (or before, if you want to test your camera and microphone) login to Parents Evening at the usual web address for your school, or click the login link from the bottom of the email confirmation you will have received.

Once logged in you will see a notice that you have upcoming video appointments and under this the details of the event, along with a *Join Video Appointments* button.

Press the button to join your appointment on the day - or to test your camera/microphone at any time.



2. Check Audio and Video

When you click Join Video Appointments the Check Audio and Video screen will be displayed. You may at this point be asked if you wish to allow access to your camera/microphone, in which case please click yes.



From here you can turn on or off your microphone and camera, change which devices are being used for the call, and check your microphone and speakers. Once you are happy, click *Proceed to Video Call*.

2. The Video Call

On this screen you can see the following, when in a call:

- At the top left the teacher name (and subject details) for the current and next appointment
- At the top right a countdown to the start of the appointment.
- At the bottom the controls for the microphone and camera.









In the middle, when your appointment is due to start, the Start Appointment button.



3. Making a call

Click the Start Appointment button. You will see yourself in the bottom right corner of the screen (unless you have no camera, or have chosen to turn it off). If the teacher has not yet joined you will see a notice to that effect in the centre of the screen.



When a teacher joins a call you will see them in the main part of the screen - or hear them, if they have no camera (or have turned it off) - and can start your discussion with them.

You will also see the remaining time for the appointment counting down in a blue bar at the top of the screen, which will turn red when the last 10 seconds begin. If anyone loses access to the system for some reason during the call, they can log in again and click *Start Appointment* on the video call screen. As long as the other person is still in

the call this will let you continue with the appointment. When the countdown in the blue bar stops the appointment time is over and the call will automatically end.

Note that if you or the teacher are late, or leave and rejoin the call, it does not reset the timer. The appointment will always end at the scheduled time.

4. Follow on calls

If you have a consecutive appointment scheduled the screen will display a *Start Next Appointment* button. When you are ready to proceed, click on it

Note that if you delay starting a call it does not extend the duration for that appointment. The appointment will always end at the scheduled times.

If you do not have a consecutive appointment, but you have not completed your final scheduled appointment you will see a countdown telling you how long until the start of your next appointment.

Once your final appointment for the evening is complete you will see a message advising you of this.



Inviting another parent/guardian to join your appointments

You can give one other parent/guardian access to join your video appointments in respect of each student linked to you that is involved in the conference. You can grant this access at the time of booking, or later if required.1. Once you have made your bookings (or when you later log in and go to *My Bookings*) click on the *Invite*. *Parent/Guardian* link at the top of the list of your bookings. If you have already sent an

2. You will then be presented with a box asking for the details of the parent/guardian to be given access.

If there is more than one student linked to you and involved in the evening they will all be shown.



You **must** enter a *Name*, and an *Email address*, as well as tick the box to consent to that person being given access to the information used to make the appointments.

If there is more than one student linked to you, choose the student(s) in respect of whose appointments the access to this person will be granted.

When you click the blue Send Invite button an email is sent to the address entered, giving them a link and details on how to join the call.

Please note that **ONLY** that one invited guest should use this link. Anyone else using it (including the parent that sent the invite, who should be logging via their own confirmation email) will knock the guest out of appointments.

Here is an example of what the invite email looks like:



3. You will then see a Manage invites box that shows your sent invitation(s), allows you to add another invite if you have any more available (the person invited can be different for each student, if wished), and allows you to Resend invites or Remove them.

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If you click Remove the link in the previously sent invitation will no longer work and that person can no longer join the video call.

Note that a call can have a maximum of 4 people in it at any one time. In cases where a school has assigned 3 teachers to take joint appointments for a class, a parent can still invite a guest, but once the number of participants in the call reaches 4 no further people can join it (unless one of them leaves).

Please ensure you have the evening of **Monday 11th December 2023 7pm** - 8pm in your diary. The Christmas Carol service at the Epsom College Chapel is the only opportunity for the whole school to be together so we expect all children to attend. PARENT WELLBEING

SERVICE

Our partnership is made up of 12 different charities and organisations working across Surrey. All coming together to support children, young people, and their families to thrive.



Our Service

The Parent Wellbeing service supports parents/carers and their families to thrive and gives young people and their parent/carers a central voice in decisions about their care and recovery.

Young people and their parents/carers will have greater choice about their options and more opportunities to access a range of services in a variety of different ways.



Parent Wellbeing Service

The Parent Wellbeing Service offers support to parents or carers whose children are experiencing poor mental health and wellbeing such as anxiety, depression, stress, self-harm and eating disorders.

The service will enable parents and carers to be a protective factor for their child/young person in their wellbeing recovery. Increasing their confidence to support their child/young person.

Practitioners will meet with parent/carers to help them identify their goals and how they can achieve positive change for them and their family. This could be through:

- Meeting with a practitioner for 1:1 support
- O Attending local groups
- O Getting advice, guidance, and information
- O Accessing phone or online support
- O Finding other support in the local community
- O Befriending other parents/carers going through similar difficulties

Support

Parent/Carers may feel it would be useful to meet with a member of the Parent Wellbeing Service for 1:1 support or via small groups.

The service will support parent/carers in deciding whether this will be useful and how many sessions they will need.

Practitioners use an outcomes-based approach to help parent/carers understand their family strengths and how they can use them to achieve their goals.



Practitioners will meet with parent/carers where they feel comfortable. That could be at home, online or out in the local community.

The Parent Wellbeing Service works within the i-THRIVE framework (Getting help and advice) The Service covers the whole of Surrey.



Referral Process

The Parent Wellbeing service works closely with the Community Wellbeing Team and referrals can be made via this team or through:

- Mindworks Surrey Access and Advice service (formally CAMHS Single point of access)
- Professionals working with the family such as education, GP, social care
- O Parents or Carers themselves
