Glyn School Open Mornings

Glyn School are holding Open Mornings next week and have asked us to share the following information with you.

There is no need to book or notify in advance of attendance. Families are simply invited to join in the morning and take a tour around our school, hosted by some younger students and take the opportunity to ask these students about Glyn School.

The only school gate open for these events will be the Main School Gate in The Kingsway, KT17 1NB. This entrance is in a residential area, so we ask visitors to Glyn School to kindly show consideration to our neighbours and avoid parking across residents' driveways on The Kingsway and surrounding roads, if parking locally.

Alternatively, families can park in the Sainsbury's Kiln Lane car park and take a 5 minute walk round to our main gate in The Kingsway. For this option, there is a footpath to the far right of the main Sainsburys' store and this will take you past one of the Glyn School gates (which will be locked at this time of day) and down to The Kingsway, at which point you leave the footpath to the right and come along The Kingsway to our main school gate. It is worth noting that Sainsbury's operate parking regulations and penalties are imposed if stays exceed the time limit. We ask that you always check the current restrictions when parking.

Apply for Secondary School Place Before October Half Term

From 1st September 2024 you can apply for a secondary school place. Surrey County Council suggest you submit your application by 25th October 2024 as this is the Friday before the half term holiday. Closing date for applications is 31st October 2024. Please also find attached below a Surrey County Council leaflet with important dates for applying.

rou can start your online application any time from 1 September 2024 but you must have completed it by 31 October 2024. We ubmit your application r 2024, before the half-

d the app ParentComms evice to receive notifications obile dev ce you have submitted your applica a will receive a confirmation email. On 3 March 2025 you will receive a an email with the outcome of your application and, if you have registered for ParentComms, you will also receive a notification with the outcome. You will need to accept or decline your offer of a school place online by 17 March 2025.

School open days will usually be held in September or October. Please check each school's website for the most up to date information about open days or evenings. You should contact schools directly if you'd like to arrange a visit. You can name up to six schools on your application form, in the order that you prefer them. Where possible the local authority will allocate a place at one of these schools. Schools will not know where you have rank them on the application form so the order your preferences does not disadvantage you The local authority has a duty to provide a place for your child but it does not have to be at one of your preferred schools. If you have an older child already at the school, you must still apply for a younger child.

If you have more than one child applying for a school place, you must make a separate application for each of them. If you live in Surrey you must apply to Surrey, even if the schools you list are outside Surrey.

Some schools may need you to submit a supplementary information form in add to the application form. Find out more a supplementary information forms at surreycc.gov.uk/admissions.

If you are registered for council tax you must supply the name of the borough a district and the council tax account nur for the property where your child norm lives. Otherwise you will be asked to pro evidence of where your child lives.

When applying online you must make sure that you press 'submit' at the end of your application and that you receiv a confirmation email which sets out yo preferences and confirms your application

applied online). If your child has an education, health and care plan, there is a separate process and you will receive more information from your child's SEND Case Officer.





REMINDERS and MORE INFORMATION

Surrey County Council Reminder Regarding Absences

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Parents Handover to Staff at Morning Clubs and Wraparound Care

Parents/carers must handover to staff at morning clubs such as dodgeball and tennis and JAG Wraparound Care. Children must **not** be left alone in the car park. Some staff have found children wandering around the car park in the morning alone which is a safeguarding issue. If you are running late then call the club leader to make them aware and then wait with your child until a member of staff can take your child through to the club.

The best way to avoid issues attending morning clubs is to allow a lot of time to be on time. The club leader waits for the majority at the main gate and then needs to go into school to start the club. Thank you for helping us keep the children safe. Parents picking up and dropping off at JAG are permitted to drive right into the staff car park (please drive extremely slowly).

Please Label All School Uniform

Please ensure all school uniform is clearly labelled. If uniform is found then the Year 6 helpers make sure the item gets returned to the correct child.

There are lots of items currently in lost property labelled with children who are no longer at our school which may be cause these items have been bought second hand and not renamed. If lost they cannot be returned to their owner. It was great to see so many people supporting the PTA second hand uniform sale on Wednesday 18th September. If you buy second hand uniform please use a permanent marker to delete old names or cut the old name tags out and clearly re-name with your child's name.

Online Safety


Online Safety is a huge, current topic for all. Technology is all around and children are accessing the internet more and more in the modern world. We therefore have regular Online Safety discussions in Computing lessons and have a focus each term on an aspect of Online Safety. Through our newsletter, we will let you know what the children are learning in their Online Safety discussions and we will keep you updated with the theme of the half term.

National Online Safety is a group we work with to promote internet safety at Wallace Fields Junior School. Our school have an accreditation with the National Online Safety group which reflects our commitment to keeping children safe online.
