Head's Update

Report Dangerous Parking

Your vigilance matters. Every report helps protect pedestrians, cyclists, and emergency services. Together, we can make our roads safer. Park respectfully - not at junctions or on double yellow lines!

We have reached an unprecedented level of dangerous and inconsiderate parking around the school premises. As a school, we are taking all possible measures to block off the school and ensure the safety of children and families. Mr Findlay, our caretaker, is working diligently each morning to manage traffic and prevent hazardous stopping. However, our authority is limited, and those who choose to park irresponsibly often disregard advice and rules designed to protect others from harm.

We ask all parents to support us by reporting any instances of dangerous or disrespectful parking that you observe. Your vigilance and cooperation are essential in helping us maintain a safe environment for every child and family. Dangerous and obstructive parking is more than an inconvenience; it can put lives at risk and it is only a matter of time before there is a serious injury or death. Your voice and actions help make our streets safer. Here is how you can take action:

When to Contact Your Local Council

- Parking on Pavements or Verges with Restrictions If waiting restrictions apply (such as yellow lines), the council can issue a penalty.

When to Call 101 (Surrey Police)

- **Dangerous Parking** Vehicles parked in hazardous locations, such as on bends or near junctions, where there are no parking controls.
- **Obstructive Parking** Vehicles blocking pavements, verges, or driveways, creating an obstruction for pedestrians, cyclists, or emergency services, especially if it forces people into the road.
- Other Issues Blocked driveways or nuisance parking.

Autism Friendly School - Removal of Bells

Following the **Autism Friendly School Audit** we have already implemented one key change already made is the reduction of school bells. Many autistic individuals find loud noises including bells disturbing and distracting and the autistic adults reported that they found the bells a stark contrast to the gentle and welcoming atmosphere of the school. Bells are not popular or common and so their reduction is a sensible step to take. Most bells have now been removed, helping to create a calmer and more inclusive environment. The bells that remain are start of day, end of morning play , end of lunch and wellbeing bell at the end of the day reminding staff to go home. The majority of the bells occur when children are in the playground, not in school building, and this will allay the fears and anxieties for the ASD children and speaking to some of them, they are already very grateful for this change.

Anti Bullying Week

This week was **Anti-Bullying Week** and all week we have been promoting positive play and friendship building between friends all week.

Our anti-bullying policy is to ensure that children learn in a supportive, caring and safe environment without fear of being bullied. If bullying is suspected or reported, the incident is

taken seriously and recorded and dealt with as soon as possible by the member of staff who has been approached. If deemed to be bullying, the teacher responsible will speak to the pupils involved. If the matter can be resolved in school without the need for parental contact then this will be done and monitored by appropriate member of staff, teacher responsible, the Deputy head and Head teacher. It may be decided that parents should be informed immediately and this will be done by the Deputy head or Head teacher. A written copy of events will be kept and this will be updated until the situation has been resolved.

This week we marked **Anti-Bullying Week** with a strong focus on promoting positive play and encouraging children to build and strengthen friendships. Throughout the week, pupils have been reminded of the importance of kindness, respect, and looking out for one another, both in the classroom and in the playground.

At Wallace Fields Juniors, we are committed to ensuring that every child learns in a supportive, caring, and safe environment, free from fear of bullying. Our anti-bullying policy makes clear that any concerns raised will be taken seriously. If an incident is suspected or reported, it will be recorded and addressed promptly by the member of staff involved. Where necessary, teachers will speak directly with the pupils concerned to resolve the matter.

In many cases, issues can be managed within school and carefully monitored by the class teacher, Deputy head, and Head teacher. However, if it is felt that parents should be informed, this will be done immediately by senior staff. A written record of events is kept and updated until the situation is resolved fully, ensuring that every step is carefully followed.

We are proud of the way our pupils have embraced the spirit of Anti-Bullying Week, showing kindness, teamwork, and understanding. Together, we continue to build a school community where every child feels safe, valued, and supported.

Being a parent or carer is also tough at times and so you might also appreciate some guidance and support. For a wide range of information, guidance, and support on wellbeing at Wallace Fields Junior School, we are committed to caring for both children and parents. Our school community works together to nurture positive mental health, encourage emotional resilience, and promote kindness. You will also find details on how we address bullying and create a safe, supportive environment where every child and every family can flourish.

This information can include the pupils rame, name of School/Academy, name of class, person trame, medical information and photograph of the child. Personal data is not stored by any member of Twelve15 central teams but held locality at the School/Academy for operational reasons.

Please be assured all information is held in accordance with data security and data retention policies and most importantly is held with the sole purpose of attending to pupils dietary needs to ensure the health and safety of the children and young adults to whom meals are served.

Pupil photographs on kitchen walls:
 Photographs are not displayed in public view; they are provided with consent from the parents and placed in a discrete place behind the counter so only visible to catering staff.

Pupil photographs in folders:
 Photographs may also be stored in folders within the kitchen or catering office. These are stored in a secure manner and only available to the catering staff.

Pupil photographs in dining hall
 Some School/Academys choose to use photographs and detail dietary requirements on a child's place
mat. Please check with your School/Academy if this practice is in place.

Allergy information including special diet request form and medical notes:
 All special diet pupils should have a special diet request form, along with any medical correspondence, submitted before a special diet can be served. This information is provided with consent from the parent and stored in a secure folder within the kitchen or catering office and School/Academy office.

Retention of Personal Data
 The data referred to will be retained only for the purposes of providing a special diet and will be confidentially disposed of when no longer required for this purpose.

England Rocks TTRs Competition

As part of our commitment to make maths exciting and high profile in our school, we are taking part in a friendly competition involving schools in England. The competition runs from 07:30 GMT **Tuesday 18th November 2025 to** 19:30 GMT **Thursday 20th November 2025**. It's all done online via play.ttrockstars.com.

Children can play in any game mode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average - the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a daily 60-minute limit (see below). Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

To support player wellbeing, there is a daily time limit of 60 minutes per player. In other words, each player can earn competition points for up to 60 minutes between **07:30 GMT and 19:30 GMT on 07:30 GMT Tuesday 18th November 2025 to 19:30 GMT Thursday 20th November 2025.** Once the player goes beyond 60 minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition. In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf but by all means encourage and support them to the extent that it doesn't cause high stress levels or impact on family plans.

The children will be expected to complete their weekly homework and any additional TTRs efforts will go towards the England Rocks Competition. We will be celebrating the most valuable players in a celebration assembly following the competition.



Outdoor/Eco-area Competition


IMPORTANT REMINDERS and OTHER NEWS

Stationery Supplies - Stationery Shop Tuesdays and Thursdays

Please remember to replenish your child's school pencil case with items such as white board pens and glue sticks.

Year 3 children are supplied with their original pencil case but will need to restock throughout the year as supplies get low. If the school staff notice they are missing items a stationery slip will be sent home.

Financial Support for Children's Instrumental Lessons

Does your child dream of learning an instrument, participating in music ensembles, or pursuing their musical potential, but financial constraints are holding you back? The Cheryl King Trust, a registered charity may well be able to help. We believe that music should be accessible to every young person, regardless of their financial circumstances. The Trust offers financial assistance for group or individual instrumental lessons with professional music teachers, music exams, accompanists, and participation in courses, workshops, and ensembles.

Your child does not need to be a musical prodigy. The Cheryl King Trust celebrates the joy of music at all levels, from beginners to advanced students.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Location: Your child must live in Surrey.
- Age: 18 years or younger.
- Income: Your combined annual family income should typically be at or below £35,000. (Exceptions may be made for incomes up to £40,000 in special cases.)

The Trust typically covers **50%-75% of costs**, with families contributing the remainder. For households with significantly lower incomes or special circumstances, higher levels of funding may be available.

How to Apply:

- 1. Complete the Application Form which you can find both at the following email address and in the attached word document: https://www.cherylkingtrust.org.uk/how to-apply
- 2. Provide Evidence of Income: Include documents such as 3 months of payslips or your most recent tax self-assessment income summary.
- 3. Submit Your Application either by post: Cheryl King Trust, c/o Marianne Windham, 24 Litchfield Way, Guildford GU2 7QH or by email: applications@cherylkingtrust.org.uk.

Once your application is reviewed and approved, the Trust will arrange to pay an agreed contribution toward your child's music lessons until the end of the current academic year. Progress reports from the music teacher will be required for funding renewal in subsequent years. Take the first step toward unlocking your child's musical journey. The Cheryl King Trust is here to support you in providing your child with the transformative gift of music.

What these sessions are all about

We've created a safe, non-judgemental space where parents can bring their questions, share worries and connect with others who 'get it'.

Topics often included:

- Understanding and responding to challenging behaviour
 Making sense of autism on a deeper level
 The ups and downs of family relationships and dynamics
 Working with schools and professionals
 Meeting like-minded parents and realising you are not alone

What parents can expect to take away:

- Feeling heard, appreciated, and understood
 Knowing they are seen as the experts on their own child and family
 Feeling hopeful and having gained practical ideas



For the last 12 months, he has been playing/training 6-7 days a week, sacrificing a lot of other things, whilst always staying positive and not losing being Sam, staying kind, positive, and humble.

We and he are aware that the main hard work begins now to stay where he is and progress further, but we are so proud of what he has achieved so far, and to be offered a professional academy contract at 8 years old is amazing, so I wanted to share this achievement with the school.
