Year 3 Lego Robot Workshop

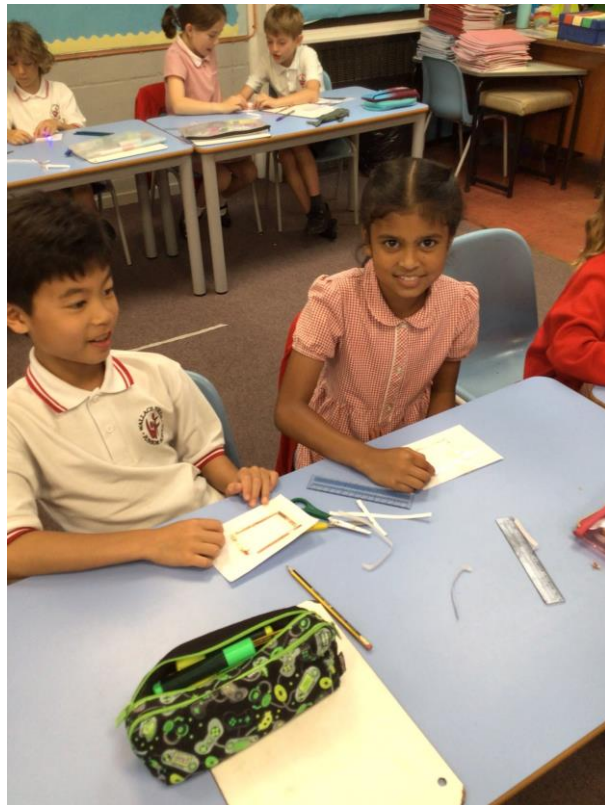
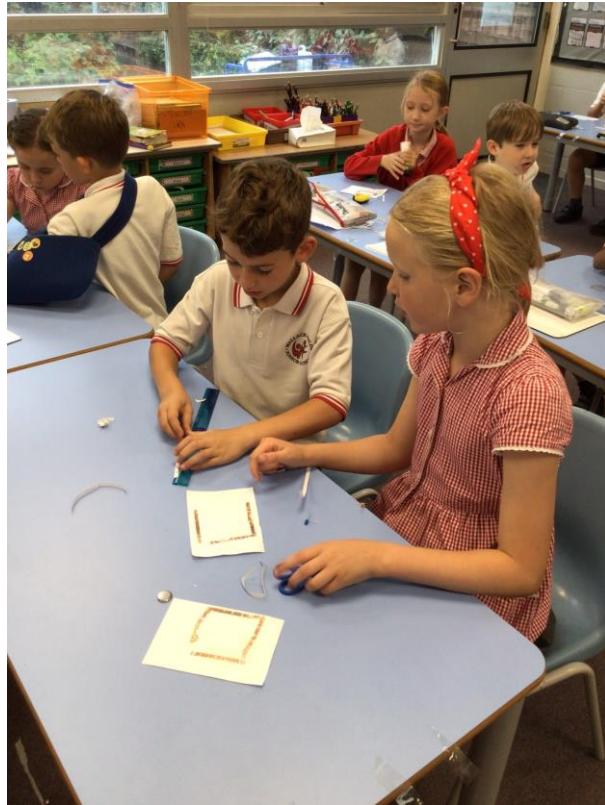

Wraparound Care Provided by Junior Adventures Group - JAG!(formerly Energy Kidz)

Junior Adventures Group Club (JAG) provides excellent wraparound care at Wallace Fields Junior School. They run Breakfast Club from 7:30am until 8:45am and After School Club from 3:20pm until 6:00pm. From September, a new part session 4.30-6pm has been created for After School Club and is live on the JAG Magic Booking system (price is £11.00). This means your child can attend a Wallace Fields Club and then join JAG at 4.30pm at the reduced price. This is from September 2023 and available to juniors only.

It would be very helpful if all parents could register on JAG <https://www.junioradventuresgroup.co.uk/term-time/after-school-club/> even if they never use JAG during their time at WFJS. This would allow a late pick up in an emergency. JAG cannot take unregistered children due to them being under a different Ofsted registration. The office cannot look after a child beyond school day and those children who are regularly picked up late must register with JAG.

ONLINE SAFETY

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about AI VIRTUAL FRIENDS

Artificial intelligence – particularly in terms of how it generates natural language – has seen significant development over the last six months, with companies releasing new AI chatbots and other digital tools. As a result, there is growing concern about the potential for these tools to be used to generate harmful or inappropriate content, or to be used to impersonate real people. This guide focuses on the risks of AI chatbots which are designed to be used by children, and the steps you can take to protect your child from these risks.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

CONTENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY

AI chatbots may not always be able to recognise when content is inappropriate or harmful and should be treated as if there is a possibility that children could be exposed to offensive language or explicit material while chatting with these virtual friends. The companies producing such AI solutions are also unlikely to take responsibility for any content that their algorithms generate.

REDUCED SOCIAL CONTACT

An excessive reliance on chatbots for social interaction could lead to children becoming isolated, reducing the amount of face-to-face communication they have, leading to social isolation. Young people become dependent on chatbots to provide companionship. It could very likely hinder the development of their real-life social skills.

LACK OF SENSITIVITY

Chatbots are not designed to pick up on subtle cues or cues that indicate signs of distress in children. At most, they may respond to explicit requests for help, but they are not designed to respond to children who are struggling or who are in need of emotional support or who are experiencing any form of abuse or neglect.

UNINTENTIONAL BIAS

AI chatbots are only as reliable as the information they've been programmed with. The algorithms used to train chatbots are often based on data that is biased or (as many originate from the US and the UK, for instance, they are often "Western-centric worldviews"). This could lead to children developing skewed attitudes and behaviours.

COGNITIVE LIMITATIONS

Although chatbots are designed to be able to understand and respond to a wide range of questions, they are not designed to understand complex concepts, context and nuance. Depending on the quality of the data used to train them, they may be able to provide a limited range of answers, but they are not designed to provide a full range of answers. This could lead to children developing a limited understanding of the world around them.

PRIVACY CONCERNS

Chatbots typically collect data about users, including personal information and preferences. This is often done to improve the chatbot's performance. However, this data is often stored in the cloud, and there is a risk that it could be accessed by third parties. This could lead to children's personal information being leaked or used in a way that is not in their best interests.

Advice for Parents & Carers

CHAT ABOUT CHATBOTS

If your child is already using a chatbot, it's important to have an open and honest conversation with them about the risks of using chatbots. Encourage them to be honest about what they are doing and to be open to your advice. CREATE A SAFE ENVIRONMENT

If your child is keen to engage with AI chatbots, encourage them to do so in a safe environment. This means that they should be using chatbots on a device that is supervised by you, and that they should be using chatbots on a device that is not connected to the internet. This will help to ensure that your child is not exposed to any inappropriate content or that their personal information is not leaked.

FIND A BALANCE

Encourage your child to establish the right balance in terms of how they might use AI-powered chatbots. 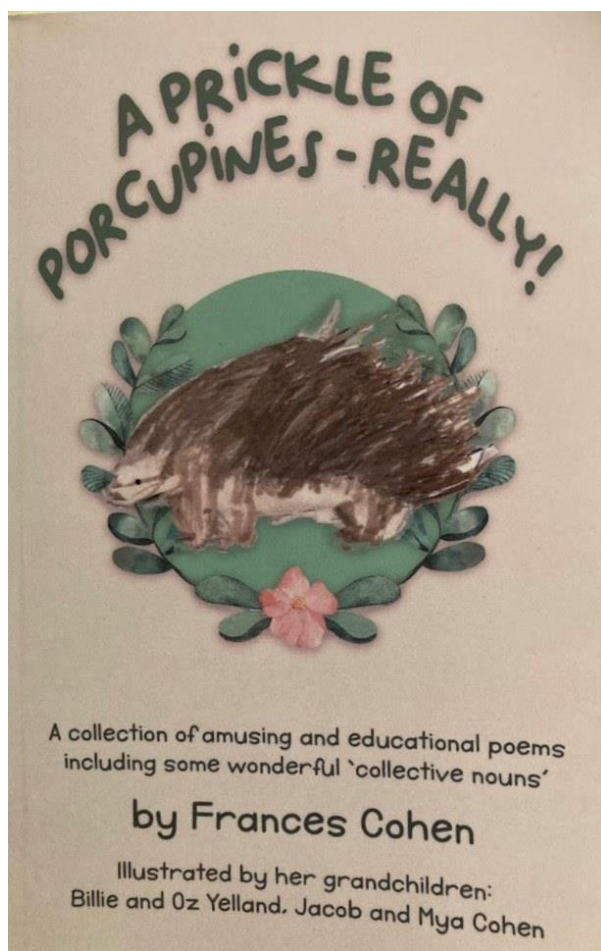
